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ROOSEVELT DECIDES TO REFORM EXISTING METHODS OF CONDUCTING CAMPAIGNS

Moved by Revelations That National Republican Committee Held Up Great Life Insurance Companies for Contributions to His Election, President Orders Bill Prepared to Make It a Criminal Act for Corporation to Give Money for Election Purposes When Its Interests May Be Affected Directly by Congressional Enactment.

DEMOCRATS HAVE LONG SOUGHT SUCH LEGISLATION.

Washington, Sept. 21.—Tardy recognition is to be given by the administration to the popular demand for reform in the existing methods of financing national political campaigns.

It was definitely made known here today that one of the first bills to be introduced in the next Congress will be an administration measure regulating the manner in which contributions shall be made to campaign committees. This bill, the President is expected to introduce, will be vigorously pushed by the Chief Executive.

ROOSEVELT MOVED BY REVELATIONS.

Committed to reform, he was greatly stirred by the revelations that were obtained by the National Republican Committee in New York. These revelations were made public by the disclosure of the records of contributions to the campaign for the Presidency in 1920, in a decidedly overwhelming manner. The President called his closest advisers together to formulate plans to meet the situation.
