**TURKISH PARLIAMENT
MEETS FOR FIRST TIME**

Constantinople, October 31.—In re-
sponse to the Imperial tirade of Sul-
tan Abdul Hamid, following his res-
toration last July of the constitution
of 1876, the first Turkish Parliament
will convene tomorrow. The Turkish
reform party, the Young Turks, is
hopeful of great and momentous re-
sults from the coming session, looking
upon it as the forerunner of a mod-
ernized and advanced nation, freed
from all the bloody despotism that
has so long disgraced Turkey in the
eyes of the civilized world and made
it the plague spot of Europe.
The present trouble in the Balkans,
the loss of Bulgaria and the possibility
of a long and ruinous war, bode ill for
the first parliament of the Turks.
Then, too, a majority of the European
residents of Constantinople look upon

the restoration of the constitution and
the convocation of a parliament as
merely a diplomatic move on the part
of Abdul Hamid. They believe that
the present dissensions in the Balkans
were foreseen by the wily old Sultan
and that his apparent change of heart
in regard to a constitutional govern-
ment was merely a "play to the gal-
leries," cleverly designed to gain the
sympathy of Europe.
Western Europeans cannot under-
stand how a government which for
centuries has practiced corruption and
tyranny can in a single day be trans-
formed into a constitutional govern-
ment, or how a monarch of the type
of the present Sultan, who since his
ascension to the throne has butchered
more than 400,000 persons and robbed
millions of his subjects, can in so
short a time become a reformer and a
benevolent ruler.



**MUCH MONEY
IN BASEBALL**

**GIANT TREES
ARE FOUND IN
THE FAR WEST**

lumbermen searching for new timber

have discovered in Tulare county, Cal-
ifornia, a new grove of giant trees,
numbering at least 15,000. The forest
is at an altitude of 6,000 feet, and ex-
ceeds in area all other forests of big
trees. The trees are said to rival in
size, height and beauty even the fa-
mous Mariposa grove.

**AMERICAN FEDERATION
TO HOLD GREAT MEETING**

Denver, October 31.—What prom-
ises to be the largest and in many
respects the most important annual
convention of the American Federa-
tion of Labor is scheduled to open
here on Monday, November 9. A
novel feature of the programme will
be an excursion to Colorado Springs,
embracing a visit to the Union Print-
ers Home as the guests of the Inter-
national Typographical Union. The
recent Boston convention of the print-
ers appropriated \$1,000 to meet the
expenses of entertaining the delegates
on this excursion. They will go to
the Springs, about seventy-five miles
on a special train.

**CAN'T PAY
INTEREST**

Chicago Traction Company Asks
Federal Court to Straighten
Out Its Affairs.

Chicago, October 31.—An appeal
has been made to the federal courts
to straighten out the affairs of the
Chicago Union Traction Company and
the Chicago Consolidated Traction
Company, as the interest on the
bonds of the corporations fall due
tomorrow. The Central Trust Com-
pany of New York, as receiver of the
companies declares that it has no
fund for the payment of the inter-

est, and has petitioned the courts
for instructions.
The petition states that the books
and accounts of the Chicago Consol-
idated Traction Company that up to
May 31, 1906, the operating expenses
exceeded the receipts by \$927,514. On
the same date, the petition recites,
the total deficit of the company, in-
cluding unpaid interest on bonds,
was \$3,357,514. Since that date inter-
est on \$657,000 bonds of the North
Shore railway had fallen due and has
not been paid. In addition interest
on the bonds of half dozen other
underlying roads and rentals on the
same roads will be due tomorrow with
no funds to pay either.
