The Natchez and Jackson is being rapidly pushed forward from Martin to the Hinds county line, and the grading on the entire new line is nearly finished.

The Gordons are at work on the road near Columbus and Aberdeen and will extend the line to the Mississippi river, making a through route to Atlanta, Ga.
