
The Final Cotton Census.

Owners and operators of ginning establishments in Monroe county are reminded that the final canvass by the Census Bureau, for enumerating cotton ginned from the crop of 1907, will commence on Monday, March 2nd. This report must include all cotton ginned to that date, with a careful estimate of amount remaining in the territory of each establishment to be ginned afterwards during the season. Oil mill linters are also to be listed with like estimate of amount to follow. Special Agents are allowed until March 10th to complete the canvass and reports to be made, by mail only, immediately upon completion. Ginner and oil mill managers are requested to be ready for prompt reports on these points.
