Ordered, that consideration of all road
petitions and other road matters be laid
over to June regular meeting

Ordered, that boundaries of Dupuyer
and Marias townships are hereby chang-
ed as follows: All that portion of town-
ship 27 north, ranges 1, 2, 3, and 4
west lying north of a line drawn due west
from the northeast corner of section 25
township 27 n range 1 w, townships 28
and 29 north and the south half of town-
ship 30 north, all in ranges 1, 2, 3 and 4
west, now forming part of Marias town-
ship, are taken from said Marias town-
ship and annexed to and made part of
Dupuyer township.

Board then appointed John J Devire,
of Pondera, to the office of Justice of the
peace, Dupuyer township.
Adjourned to 2 p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Board reassembled at 2 p. m. Present,
Commissioners M Connelly and Wm M
Foster, and the clerk. In the absence of
Chairman Perkins, Commissioner Foster
was chosen chairman pro tem.

Board then appointed Geo W Walker,
of Cut Bank, Justice of the peace for
Marias township.

Proposition was submitted by trustees
of school district No. 1, for the estab-
lishment of a county free high school at
Choteau, the county seat of Teton Co,
under the provisions of the county free
high school act of March 3, 1899. Same
was approved and ordered filed, and the
following order was made by the board:

It is hereby ordered that the proposi-
tion of the board of trustees of school
district number one of Teton county,
Montana, for the establishment of a
county free high school at Choteau, the
county seat of said county, be and the
same is hereby accepted by the Board of
commissioners of Teton county, Mon-
tana, and in accordance therewith and
the provisions of the County Free High
school act of March 3, 1899, said county
free high school for Teton county is
hereby ordered established at Choteau,
the county seat of said Teton county,
Montana.

Board then audited accounts of its
members, and ordered warrants drawn
in payment.

The regular March term of the board
was then adjourned sine die.
List of warrants allowed will be pub-
lished next week.

Proceedings of the Board of County
Commissioners of Teton County
Montana Regular March Term 1901.

(OFFICIAL)

CHOTEAU, MONTANA, March 1, 1901.
Board met in regular March session,
at the office of the county clerk, at 10 a.
m. Present, Chairman C B Perkins,
Com'r. Wm M Foster, and the clerk.

Minutes of regular December meeting,
and of special meeting of January 7, 1901,
were read and approved.

Board proceeded to examine reports
of County and township officers for the
quarter ending Feb. 28, 1901. The fol-
lowing were approved and ordered filed.

A C Warner, county clerk. Report of
warrants issued in payment of salaries
of county officers, amounting to \$2,450.99
on the contingent fund, and \$1,033.06 on
general fund.

A C Warner, county clerk. Report of
official fees collected, amounting to \$258-
00, with treasurer's receipts for same.

Sterling McDonald, clerk district
court. Report of official fees collected
and paid to treasurer, amounting to
\$77.45.

Wm D Hagen, Sheriff. Report of offi-
cial fees collected for portion of quarter,
amounting to \$10.00, with treasurer's
receipt for same.

Geo C Taylor, Sheriff. Report of offi-
cial fees collected for part of quarter,
amounting to \$13.00, with treasurer's
receipt for same.

Wm D Hagen, Sheriff. Report of jail
orders for part of quarter. Warrant
ordered for expenses incurred.

Geo C Taylor, Sheriff. Report of jail

DA Peery, Assessor. Final report
showing collections of \$12.00. Special
road tax, and \$12.00 special poor tax,
an paid to treasurer, less ten per cent
expenses of collection. Clerk authorized
to close Mr. Peery's account in accord-
ance with report.

M D Cooper, Justice of peace Choteau
township. Report of criminal actions
for part of quarter. Warrant ordered
for costs incurred.

Geo C Taylor, Justice of the peace,
Dupuyer township. Report of criminal
actions for part of quarter. Warrant
ordered for costs incurred.

J H Boucher, Justice of the peace St.
Mary's township. Report of criminal
actions for quarter ending Nov. 30, 1900.
Warrants ordered for costs incurred.

Wm Dawes, Justice of the peace,
Marias township. Report as acting cor-
oner, of inquest held on body of John
Brester. Warrants ordered for costs
incurred.

Adjourned to 2 p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Board reassembled at 2 p. m. same
members present, and continued exam-
ination of reports for quarter ending
Feb. 28, 1901.

Contractor's poor house report of Wm
Bruce, showing five inmates cared for
during quarter, was approved and or-
dered filed.

Reports of Argus Bruce and Ed Boll-
rud, road supervisors, were approved
and warrants ordered for expenses in-
curred.

Report of H F England, county treas-
urer, for period from Dec. 1, 1900 to and
including March 2, 1901, was considered.

Treasurer's list of licenses issued was
compared with stubs of license books
and found correct.

Lists of warrants paid were compared
with county clerk's books, found correct,
and warrants were cancelled as follows:

Ordered that treasurer transfer \$3,000
from the general fund to the Contingent
fund.

Adjourned to 10 a. m. March 5.

SECOND DAY.

March 5, 1901. Board met at 10 a. m.
Present Chairman C B Perkins, Com-
missioners M Connelly, Wm M Foster,
and the clerk.

Petition was presented by C R Sciffin,
asking for rebate of taxes on 1,180 head
of stock sheep, being number over-asses-
sed to him. After due consideration,
petition was granted and warrant order-
ed for amount of county taxes overpaid.

Ordered, that a deputy be allowed the
county assessor for the months of April,
May and June, 1901, at a salary of \$75
per month.

Adjourned to p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Board reassembled at 2 p. m. All
members present.

Ordered that contract be entered into
with C E Treseott for the county print-
ing and publishing for one year from
March 10, 1901, at legal rates, excepting
books which shall be furnished at ten
per cent over cost prices. Bond to be
furnished in sum of \$2,000.

Petition was presented asking for the
appointment of Walter Dolson as Justice
of the Peace, Marias township to fill
vacancy. Petition granted and appoint-
ment ordered.

Board then authorized the sheriff to
employ a deputy at Altyn and one at
Cut Bank, from March 15, 1901, at a
salary of fifty dollars per month each.
Adjourned to 10 a. m. March 6.

THIRD DAY.

Board met at 10 a. m. All members
present.

Claim of Montana Land and Water
Co., for rebate of taxes on certain tracts
of land, was disallowed.

C E Treseott presented contract for
printing and publishing for one year
from March 10, 1901, accompanied by
bond in the sum of two thousand dol-
lars, with Wm Bruce and Thomas Brooks
as sureties. Bond approved and con-
tract signed.

Ordered that county officers requiring
any official printing or publishing shall
obtain an order for same from the county
clerk.

Board then checked receipt of Treas-
urer John S Gordon to ex-treasurer H
F England, for county funds on hand at
the close of business March 2, 1901,
amounting to \$27,113.62. Same was
found correct, and final report of H F
England, outgoing county treasurer was
then approved and ordered filed.

Board then proceeded to audit claims
against county. Warrants were ordered
in payment of those allowed.

Following claims were disallowed.

E O Barlow meals for judges and
clerks of election seven dollars, as not a
proper charge against the county.

Wm Miller salary dep sheriff Jan 7 to
Jan 12, 1901 ten dollars, dep shif Leech
having drawn pay for same period.

Adjourned 2 p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Board reassembled at 2 p. m. All
members present, and proceeded to visit
and inspect the county jail, same being
found in good condition.

Report of Jno W Shields, county sur-
veyor, for period from Dec 1, 1900 to
January 6, 1901, was then examined, ap-
proved and ordered filed.

Board resumed auditing of claims
against county, and warrants were or-
dered in payment of those allowed.

Claim of Chas D Phemister, for burial
of R Widall \$150 was disallowed as not
being a proper charge against Teton
county.

Adjourned to 10 a. m. March 7.

FOURTH DAY.

March 7, 1901. Board met at 10 a. m.

All members present.

Ordered that county clerk advertise
for bids to be submitted at June regular
meeting for painting county jails at Du-
puyer and Shelby.

Report of James Sulgrove, Co. Atty.
for quarter ending Feb 28, 1901, was ex-
amined, approved and ordered filed.

County Attorney was authorized to
employ a stenographer and typewriter for
months of March, April and May,
1901, at fifteen dollars per month for
county's share of salary.

Board then audited claims against
county, and ordered warrants drawn in
payment of those allowed.

Adjourned to 2 p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Board reassembled at 2 p. m. All
members present, and proceeded to in-
spect the poor farm, which was found in
good condition.

Adjourned to 10 a. m. March 8.

FIFTH DAY.

March 8, 1901. Board met at 10 a. m.
All members present.

Ordered, that wire screens be placed
on county jail windows.

Following reports for quarter ending
Feb 28, 1901, were examined, approved
and ordered filed.

George W Magee, Justice of the peace,
Dupuyer township. Report of criminal
actions. Warrant ordered for costs in-
curred.

Wm Dawes, Justice of the peace,
Marias township. Report of fines col-
lected and paid to county treasurer,
amounting to \$55.

Thos Cowan, Justice of the peace, St.
Mary's township. No criminal business.
Fannie E Chenoweth, Co Supt schools
Report of transactions of office, showing
official visit made and teacher's examina-
tions held.

Board resumed auditing of claims
against county. Warrants were ordered
drawn in payment of those allowed.

Following claims were disallowed as
not properly chargeable to Teton county:

T J Moore, services special jailer \$50.

Wm Bruce for disinfectant \$8.50.

Ordered, that county clerk draw war-
rant on general fund in favor of H K
Farris, for one car of coal for county
jail, when same shall have been deliv-
ered.

Ordered, that Chairman Perkins is
authorized to go to Great Falls on busi-
ness connected with suit of S M Corson
against county.

Permission to leave the state for a
period not exceeding sixty days was
granted to Com'r's Connelly and Foster.

were then made:
