You are hereby notified that the Town Council of Columbia Falls, Montana, by Resolution No. 165 on file in the office of the Town Clerk and duly passed by the said Council at its regular meeting held June 7, 1948, thereby states its intention to create Special Improvement District 7, to include the following described property:

Beginning at the Southeast Corner of Lot 9, Block 5 of Rutherford's Addition; thence North to

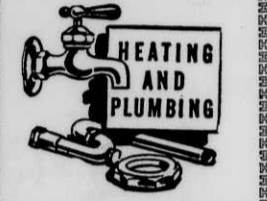

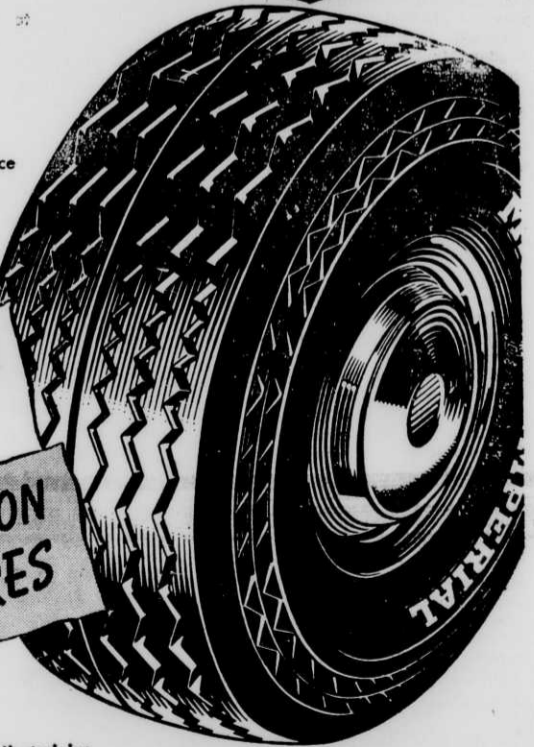
