ABOUT CITY FINANCES

Taxes Due for the Year All in the Hands of the Treasurer.

NOT MORE THAN IS WANTED

After Outstanding Warrants are Paid, the City's Coffers Will be Nearly Empty—The Sources of Revenue.

BUTTE, Dec. 22.—The remainder of the city taxes due for the year was received by the city treasurer to-day, and is something of a disappointment.

Total taxes received \$10,178.92. In the opinion of the city treasurer there will be enough money left in the treasury after all outstanding warrants and floating debt are paid to run the city a month.

That is to say, there will be a remainder sufficient to pay the December expenses of the city government. Next month the city will have to begin again registering warrants and paying interest at 10 per cent on them until a year hence, when next year's taxes will be in.
