per control, was put on approved list along with chlordane and toxaphene by hopper control representatives of 26 states meeting in Denver. Only 2 ounces of aldrin per acre is enough to kill 90 percent of hoppers present in contrast with need for using from ½ to 1 pound of chlordane or 1 to 1½ pounds of toxaphene per acre for similar results. J. H. Pepper, Montana state entomologist, said use of aldrin increases effective payload of spraying planes and also requires less "war important" chlorine than other poisons in manufacture.

**Land classification bill**—More equitable taxation within counties and fairer distribution of state funds allocated to public schools would be among benefits from bill to be introduced in 1951 Montana legislature, calling for uniformity in classification of lands for tax purposes. State board of equalization will sponsor bill and they estimate cost of classification of real estate and appraisal of improvements in both urban and rural areas at about \$2,000,000.

**Vo-ag students hit aims**—About 1,000 Montana Future Farmers had an investment in farming of \$743,886, according to A. W. Johnson, state supervisor of vocational agriculture. This investment indicates vocational agriculture students were really attaining No. 1 objective—establishment in farming, said Mary M. Condon, state superintendent of public instruction. Johnson reports this investment was in beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, swine, wheat, land, small grains, potatoes, sugar beets, alfalfa, poultry and gardens. The 1,000 Future Farmers completed 1,579 farm enterprises and turned in detailed records on them this last year.

**High Jerseys tested**—A herd average of 8,439 pounds of milk and 472 pounds of butterfat per cow during a year-long testing period was set by registered Jerseys owned by Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Clawson, Lake county. Herd improvement registry testing was done by Montana State college and verified by American Jersey cattle club. Herd had an average number of 6 cows during testing. Butterfat production was over two times U. S. average.

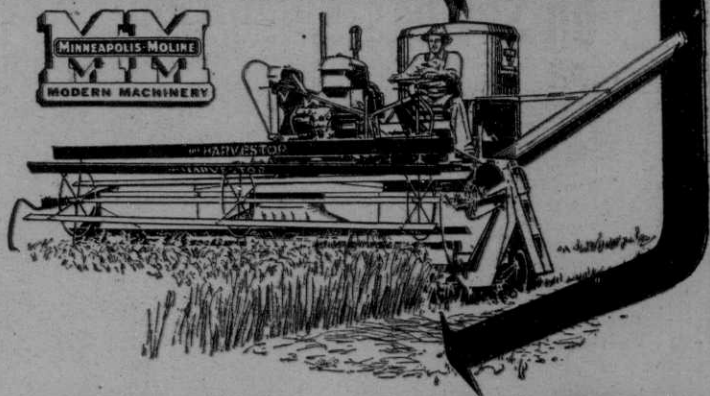
