ATHENS, April 20.—The news of the capture of Damasi has put a new complexion upon the situation of the frontier. In a great commingling of the government, and is likely to have the most exhilarating effect upon the spirits of the Greeks, who had been greatly depressed by the reverses of their troops at Milouna Pass. NEW IRISH LEAGUE FORMED

John Redmond and Followers Hold a Secret Conference.

FORM AN INDEPENDENT ORGANIZATION

Agrarian Interests Are Not to Be Dominant in the League.

Members of the League in London and Followers Walk Out of the Conference.

DUBLIN, April 20.—There were many prominent Parnellites present at the convention summoned to meet in this city today by John E. Redmond. The meeting was private. A resolution was adopted providing for the formation of an independent Irish league, one in which agrarian interests are not to be dominant, and which will be founded upon the broader and sounder basis of independent political action for the benefit of the whole Irish nation.

THE OBJECT OF THE LEAGUE WILL BE "CIVIL LIBERTY, AND NO FURTHER INTERFERENCE OF PRIESTS IN POLITICS; ABSOLUTE INDEPENDENCE OF ALLIANCES WITH ANY ENGLISH PARTY AND REVERTING TO THE OLD DEMAND FOR CO-ORDINATE PARLIAMENTS; THE PRINCIPLE OF FEDERALISM IN MR. GLADSTONE'S HOME RULE PROPOSALS, AND MANHOOD SUFFRAGE WHICH WILL GIVE THE PARNELLITE A POLITICAL MAJORITY IN IRELAND.

THE LEAGUE WILL ALSO URGE THE IMMEDIATE REDRESS OF IRELAND'S FINANCIAL GRIEVANCES, AMNEITY FOR ALL POLITICAL PRISONERS, LAND LAW REFORM, AND THE DEVELOPMENT AND ENCOURAGEMENT OF LABOR AND THE INDUSTRIAL RESOURCES OF THE COUNTRY, ETC.

MR. REDMOND OPENED THE CONFERENCE WITH A DISPASSIONATE SPEECH, IN WHICH HE STATED THE PRESENT CONDITION OF THE PARTY NEEDED VIGOROUS REORGANIZATION. HE REFERRED TO THE PRESENT CONVENTION AS A MEANS OF BRINGING ABOUT THE REFORMS WHICH HE BELIEVES TO BE IN THE INTERESTS OF THE COUNTRY.

MR. REDMOND ANNOUNCED HIS READINESS TO RESIGN THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE PARTY, OR IF THEY PREFERRED, TO REMAIN, AS ALL PRESENT WERE INVITED TO INDULGE IN THE FREEST AND MOST ENTHUSIASTIC DISCUSSION.

HARRINGTON WALKS OUT.

Timothy Harrington rose, and, in a calm speech, objected absolutely to the formation of the new league.

MR. REDMOND FOLLOWS, MAINLY IN FAVOR OF THE AMENDMENT, AND MR. HARRINGTON'S MOTION AGAINST THE FORMATION OF THE LEAGUE WAS DEFEATED BY A VOTE OF 230 TO 21.

MR. HARRINGTON THEN LEFT THE HALL WITH HIS SUPPORTERS.

GRANT MONUMENT DEDICATION.

Arrangements Completed for the President's Journey to New York.

WASHINGTON, April 20.—The arrangements for the president's trip to New York for the dedication of the Grant monument, April 26, have been perfected. Vice President Hobart and the members of the senate and house will leave here on Monday evening over the Baltimore & Ohio on Tuesday.
