Ringer Acting Mayor—Police Commissioner Ringer was acting mayor of Omaha Friday, both Mayor Smith and Commissioner Ure being out of the city.

Six Mexicans Injured—Six Mexican track laborers were injured, three probably fatally, when a gasoline car on which they were riding jumped the Burlington track near Ashland, Neb., Friday.

39 Autos Recovered—Of 40 automobiles stolen in Omaha in June, 39 have been recovered. Police Commissioner Ringer said Friday. During June, 1919, 72 automobiles were stolen and only 59 recovered, records show.

Turn In Middle of Block—Hereafter, motorists in the business section of the city must turn around in the middle of the block, instead of at intersections, Police Commissioner Ringer announced Friday after a conference with traffic officers.
