### PROGRESS OF RUNNING MEET

Track is Somewhat Heavy, but Sport is Lively Enough.

### HORNE SHOWS 'EM HOW TO GO SOME

"Doc" Reichford, Old-Time Turfman, Comes from St. Louis with His String of Bridle-Wise Ponies—Summary of Events.

A track that was somewhat heavy did not interfere in any particular with the success of the second day of the racing meet at Exposition park, postponed from Friday because of the rain.

The going will be this afternoon be perfect, and five big races will be run. One is already entered. In another twelve animals are booked. Hot competition is assured in all.

Famous old "Doc" Reichford of St. Louis made a big hit when he appeared for the first time at the track yesterday. He had just arrived with five horses from the Kinloch park track in the Missouri town, and as soon as he saw the character of the meet he telegraphed back for the remainder of his string, seventeen in all. "Doc" has raced horses in Omaha since 1879, and his quintet will be certain to make a good showing today, as he has horses in every race.

The big hit of yesterday's card was the third race, a seven-eighths mile dash, in which Horne, a 3 to 2 shot, beat Bonner, the favorite at 4 to 5, in a beautiful finish. Horne is a little dark brown stallion, bred in Ohio, and was a good winner and is well liked, but the talent was sure that Bonner was the better horse, taking into consideration the distance and the running.

As usual, at the start Bonner was slow, and was well to the rear. But on the second lap at the eighth pole he came away up and people all said that he would exercise his usual tactics, passing the lead horse, and such a terrific pace that Bonner could not make a final spurt, and lost in the end. Horne came in a winner by two lengths free of lash or rowels, while Bonner was under the whip behind. Emerald took second. After a dozen attempts to get Enchant away with the rest, he was left at the post. The time was 1:36.

The second race, four and a half furlongs, brought out the big field, nine starters, with not a single scratch. Billy Derby, the favorite at 2 to 3, gratified the bookies by taking first money in 1:24. Glads, a good evening half-mile dasher, was second, while Backwood took third, being rated at 4 to 1. Meanwhile Decelt and Coral, second place choices at 2 to 1 and 3 to 1 respectively, were not there for a place.

Great excitement resulted from the first event, a five-eighths mile dash for 2-year-olds, for See Key fell at the first turn, taking a long slide, with his jockey mixed in somewhere.
