

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Market Being Looked Upon as a Two-Sided Affair.

CORN IS NOT BREAKING RIGHT

Traders Posted on Yellow Cereals Not Satisfied with the Disposition That Cereals are Maintaining.

OMAHA, Feb. 14, 1914.

Cash sales of grain at Chicago yesterday were 60,000 bushels of wheat, 80,000 bushels of corn and 11,000 bushels of oats.

A disposition existed among wheat traders last night to look upon the market as a two-sided affair. For the time being, bears were disposed to predict a decline of 1 to 2 cents as the best thing to do for the market in the near future.

Traders who have studied the corn market closely of late said it does not break right for the bears and it is not expected to for some time.

Considerable confusion exists among wheat traders over the report of export business and the demand therefor. One of the leading Duluth traders, who has been handling 2,000,000 bushels of wheat abroad within a week, including 300,000 bushels of No. 2, for this season, said he had a lot of durum, but the trade refused to accept these figures, claiming 1,000,000 bushels of it already reported, and a careful canvass of the seaboard exporters showed their bids were 10 to 20 out of ten loads of wheat at Duluth, and that the city one exporter said bids were at the market, but there was no profit.

Another exporter said foreigners were not too anxious to purchase on the present basis, but would on a decline of 20c.

Cash wheat was up to 54c lower. Cash corn was up to 54c lower.

At Liverpool wheat closed bid lower to 1/2 higher.

Primary wheat unchanged to bid higher, and shipments 350,000 bu., against 400,000 bu. last year.

Primary corn receipts were 50,000 bu., and shipments 45,000 bu., against receipts of 4,000,000 bu. and shipments of 1,150,000 bu. last year.

Primary oats receipts were 43,000 bu., and shipments 64,000 bu., against receipts of 330,000 bu. and shipments of 48,000 bu. last year.
