**THE BOSS OF THE LAZY Y.** By Charles Allen Seltzer. 347 pp. \$1.50. A. C. McClurg & Co.

In the opening chapter Calumet Marston, famed throughout Texas, bronco-buster and cowboy, is returning, after an absence of many years, to his father's ranch on the edge of the desert. He finds that his father is dead and the ranch is being run by a young woman, who, according to his father's will, is to remain in charge until sundry conditions are accepted by Calumet. As these conditions make for the reforming of that individual's somewhat turbulent disposition, he naturally balks and declares war upon the "boss." He is soon called upon, however, to fight his father's enemies, incidentally those of the "boss," and some exciting adventures ensue. The question of who is "boss" at the end of the book is in a sense left to the reader's imagination.

**STEVE OF THE HARG RANCH.** By Marlon Reid-Girardot. 37 pp. \$1. Hearst's International Library.

A story of cowboy activities, in which the aim of the author has been to make a true and graphic picture of that life than to tell a closely woven story. He has provided plenty of stirring incident, but he narrates these events with such detail as to make his pages a panorama of cowboy life rather than the moving picture of swift action along whose lines most authors of western stories fashion their tales.

**THE GIRL OF THE BLUE RIDGE.** By Payne Erskine. 401 pp. \$1.50. Little, Brown & Co.

Larry Barb is a beautiful, untrained girl, whose innate instincts are fine and high, so that she takes up the burdens fate has put upon her with a loyalty and patience. Her love story, her development when brought into contact with the outside world, and her final evolution into the exalted creature who wins alike mountaineer and discriminating man of the world, are told by a series of dramatic episodes.

**THE WHITE ALLEY.** By Carolyn Wells. 300 pp. \$1.25. J. B. Lippincott company.

The sixth novel in which the suave and polished detective, Fleming Stone, has appeared at the necessary moment to solve a mystery and place the responsibility for crime upon unsuspected shoulders. In this book he is not brought into the action until almost the end of the story, when suspicion, after hovering around the head of the heroine, has turned to certainty in the minds of all the other characters and settled upon the former secretary of the dead man. The scene of the mystery is a fine old mansion and its grounds just above New York, and the occasion is a house party which the owner of the estate, a middle-aged, wealthy man, stern and precise, gives in honor of his fiancée. One morning the host is missing and presently his dead body is found concealed in the cellar. An ingenious, complete and up-to-date burglar alarm system takes an important part in the story, helping to deepen the mystery.

**BRAM OF FIVE CORNERS.** By Arnold Milder. 38 pp. \$1.25. A. C. McClurg & Co.

Eugenic finds its apotheosis in this picture of youth life among the Michigan Hollanders. Bram is a bright, ambitious boy, hampered by race traditions, but blessed by the companionship of a wise, liberal-minded minister. How his first love affair came to disaster through the influence of modern education, and how the new proved to be the true, beautiful, and lasting, is told with the author's ability to interpret the life of a people in our midst. Little known.

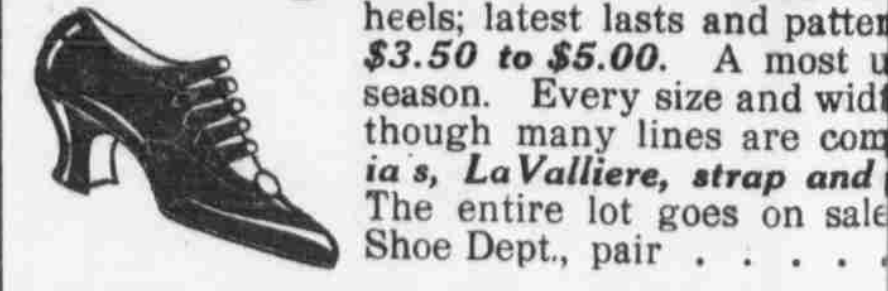
