In reply to an inquiry which has been submitted to me, I beg to say that I have appeared in cases several times in recent years in the new court-house, at Marshall, N. C., and, that, in my judgment, said court-house is one of the very best in western North Carolina, in fact its acoustic properties are much superior to those of our own court-house here at Asheville.

The main court room, at Marshall, is a fine auditorium and is comfortable and convenient in every respect for bench, bar and spectators; and the offices in the building, occupied by county officials, are satisfactory in every way so far as I have been able to learn. On the whole, I should say that the money represented in the erection of the court-house at Marshall, has been well spent, and that for any county in this section of the state, no larger than Madison, the general style of the court-house at Marshall could be safely and even profitably followed. I believe no valid objections could be lodged against such a building for such a county.
