Tax Selling Brings Out Large Blocks Of Low-Priced Issues

By BERNARD S. O'HARA — NEW YORK, Dec. 12.—Continuing to exhibit mild irregularity, the stock market, on balance, today finished an uneventful week exactly where it started.

As in the past several sessions, tax selling brought out large blocks of low-priced issues and relieved an otherwise sluggish performance. There were several wide specialty gainers but leaders generally fluctuated in a narrow range. The direction was cloudy at the opening and the price fog was moderately thick, when the final gong sounded.

Earnings and dividend hopes brought bids for many favorites. Speculative and investment contingents, on the whole, inclined to step softly pending North African war developments and more indications as to how far year-end tax adjustments would go in the next week or so.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was unchanged on the day and week at 40. Transfers totaled 340,730 shares, best for a short stretch since Nov. 7, and compared with 246,016 a week ago.

Stocks touching new tops for the year included American radiator preferred, up 6 3/4; New York Harlem preferred, up 5; Budd Mfg., preferred up 2; American Viscose, up 3 1/4, and Industrial Rayon, up 3 1/2. Dealings in most of these was on a restricted basis.

The senior Budd issue attracted attention on reports progress was being made on a refinancing plan which would consider clearing up back dividends amounting to \$84 a share as of Nov. 1. American Car Foundry jumped 2 1/2 on the disclosure of a broad increase in company profits.

Eastman Kodak and J. C. Penny were up a point or so each. Lesser advances were retained by Chrysler, General Motors, U. S. Steel, American Telephone, Southern Pacific, U. S. Rubber, United Aircraft, International Telephone, Sears Roebuck, Standard Oil (NJ) and Texas Co.

On the offside were Bethlehem, Southern Railway, Union Pacific, Westinghouse, Montgomery Ward, International Harvester, Allied Chemical, Anaconda, Johns-Manville and Douglas Aircraft.

Curb stocks in plus territory, were Aluminum of America preferred, Consolidated Gas of Baltimore and American Gas. Losers included Beech Aircraft and Standard Steel Spring. The aggregate here was 71,935 shares versus 54,665 last Saturday.
