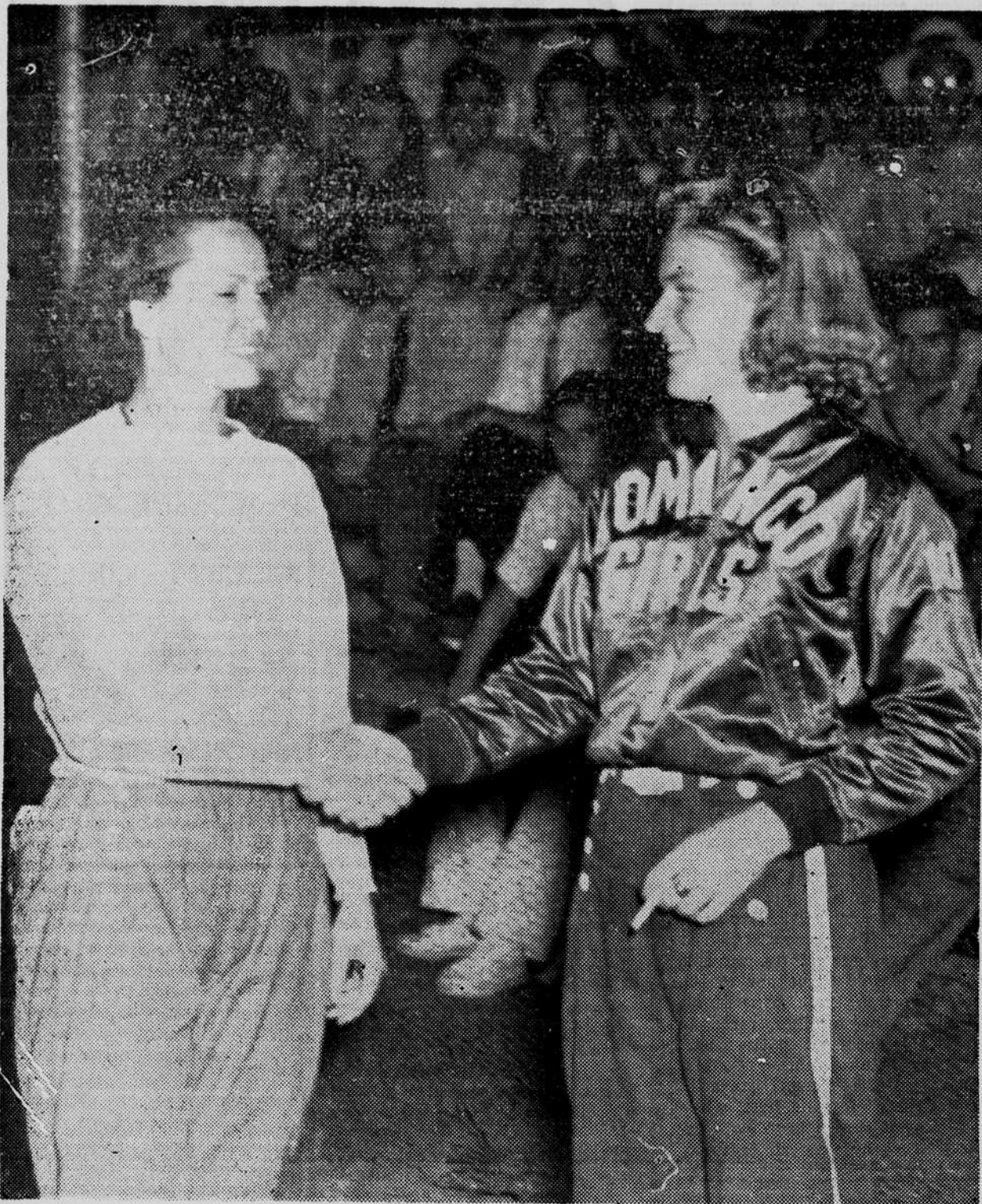


TOURNEY VICTOR AND VANQUISHED

F. S. KEMP MADE VICE COMMANDER AT LARGE OF THE 29TH DIVISION

F. S. Kemp, personnel manager of the Roanoke and Patterson Mills companies here, was elected vice-commander at large at the annual convention of the 29th division of World War veterans—New Jersey, Maryland, District of Columbia, and Virginia National Guard troops—held in Norfolk on August 30, 31, September 1 and 2 in the Monticello Hotel.

Another North Carolinian, H. D. Jones of Graham, was elected national commander of the association. Mr. Kemp was a member of Company A of Maryland during the World War.

Retirement of Mrs. Francis Perkins as Secretary of Labor and immediate deportation of Harry Bridges, West Coast labor leader, were demanded in a resolution adopted Sunday. The measure charged Mrs. Perkins "has heretofore protected known advocates operating as fifth columnists", naming specifically Bridges, whom the resolution termed a "self-confessed red".

Mr. Kemp served as a member of the committee which drew up the above resolutions.
