# JULY'S DRAFT QUOTA

## HALIFAX DRAFT QUOTA FOR JULY SET AT 77 MEN

### 52 Whites And 25 Negroes Will Be Called

State Selective Service headquarters have announced the various quotas for draft board in North Carolina, which will call 3,429 white youths and 1,000 Negroes to the colors during July in the largest single draft call yet issued in this State.

Quotas for the two Halifax County draft boards are:

No. 1, Roanoke Rapids, 24 white men to report to Fort Bragg on July 8; No. 2, Enfield, 28 white men to report to Fort Bragg on July 14; No. 2, Enfield, 15 Negroes to report to Fort Jackson on July 15; No. 1, Roanoke Rapids, 10 Negroes to report to Fort Jackson on July 16.

Three Negroes were sent by the draft board here to Fort Bragg this morning for induction into the army under the Selective Service Act. They were Thomas Pitchford, Littleton; Roy Thomas, Weldon; and Joseph Samuel Malone, Roanoke Rapids.

#### JULY REGISTRATION

Registration of those men who were born on or between October 17, 1919, and July 1, 1920, in the second registration under the Selective Service Act will take place from 7 a. m. until 9 p. m. on Tuesday, July 1. Aliens, as well as American citizens, who become 21 years of age before midnight July 1, 1941, must register.

M. McRae Faison, clerk of Halifax Draft Board No. 1, here, said today around 200 men under the jurisdiction of the local board are expected to register. The men will be registered at the board's office in the Kidd Building here. At Weldon in the Emery Building on Washington Avenue formerly occupied by the Durant Jewelry Store, and at Littleton in Kenyon's Store on Main Street. Members of the local draft board and other assistants will register the men.

### Probable Cause Found Against Three Men Here

Bruce Williams, Keely Enright and Walter Enright, local white men, were given a hearing here before Mayor Kelly Jenkins last Friday morning on charges of stealing a quantity of coffee from the Seaboard Airline Railway freight depot on June 18.

Probable cause was found against the trio, and they were bound over to county recorder's court at Halifax under \$300 each. They were charged with larceny of about 12 pounds of coffee from the railroad.

## GIRL IS INJURED BY AUTO

*Josephine Dunstan, 12-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Dunstan of this city, was seriously injured when struck by an automobile driven by Ed Griffin of near Roanoke Rapids.*

The girl suffered a crushed jaw and other head injuries in addition to bruises and lacerations, and although she is given a chance to recover local hospital attaches described her condition as "grave" early this week.

Witnesses stated that the girl ran out in front of Griffin's car from between a string of vehicles parked at a railroad crossing, and that the accident was unavoidable.

Chief of Police H. E. Dobbins investigated the accident, and said no charges have been preferred against the driver of the car pending the outcome of the girl's condition. She was living with Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Hux.

Griffin was headed north, having crossed the railroad just ahead of the train, and struck the girl last Friday afternoon about 4 o'clock when she darted across the street in front of his vehicle on the way to a store for some ice cream. Griffin has been employed at the Patterson mills here for about three months, and came to the city from Nash County. He lives on the Roanoke Rapids-Weldon highway just outside the city limits.

### Navy Desires Enlistments For Reserve

The Navy Department desires to obtain a large number of young men between 17 and 28, unmarried and who have mechanical aptitude, for Class V-2, U. S. Naval Reserve. These men, upon completion of recruit training, if qualified, will be sent to an aviation school for training leading to Aviation Machinist, Aviation Metalsmith, Photographer and Aviation Pilot.

Men are paid, furnished free food, lodging, clothes and medical care while learning, and have an assured future in a growing industry which no doubt will be larger than the present automobile field after the present emergency is ended.

Schools are maintained for this specialized training in Florida at Pensacola and Jacksonville, and in Illinois at Great Lakes.

Selective Service Registration does not prevent anyone from joining the Naval Reserve or Navy. Investigate the Navy Schools and Trades today at any of the Navy Recruiting Stations located in North and South Carolina, or write personally to Lt.-Commander

### Coast Guard Has Vacancies For Young Men

There are still many vacancies in the U. S. Coast Guard for desirable young men between the ages of 18 and 31. To be eligible for enlistment, an applicant shall not be less than 18 or more than 31 years of age. A person over 31 and not over 40 years of age, who has had previous service in the Coast Guard, Navy

or Marine Corps, and whose discharge was under honorable conditions, may be enlisted if otherwise qualified, and the length of such previous service is equal to or greater than the excess of his age over 31 years. Credits will be given in this connection, for previous service in the Navy or Marine Corps.

A person discharged from the Coast Guard or the Navy under honorable conditions entitling him for re-enlistment, and in the case of a person discharged from the Coast Guard who fails to re-enlist within three months from date of discharge. Those discharged in the rating next below that held by him at the time of discharge. Those discharged in the

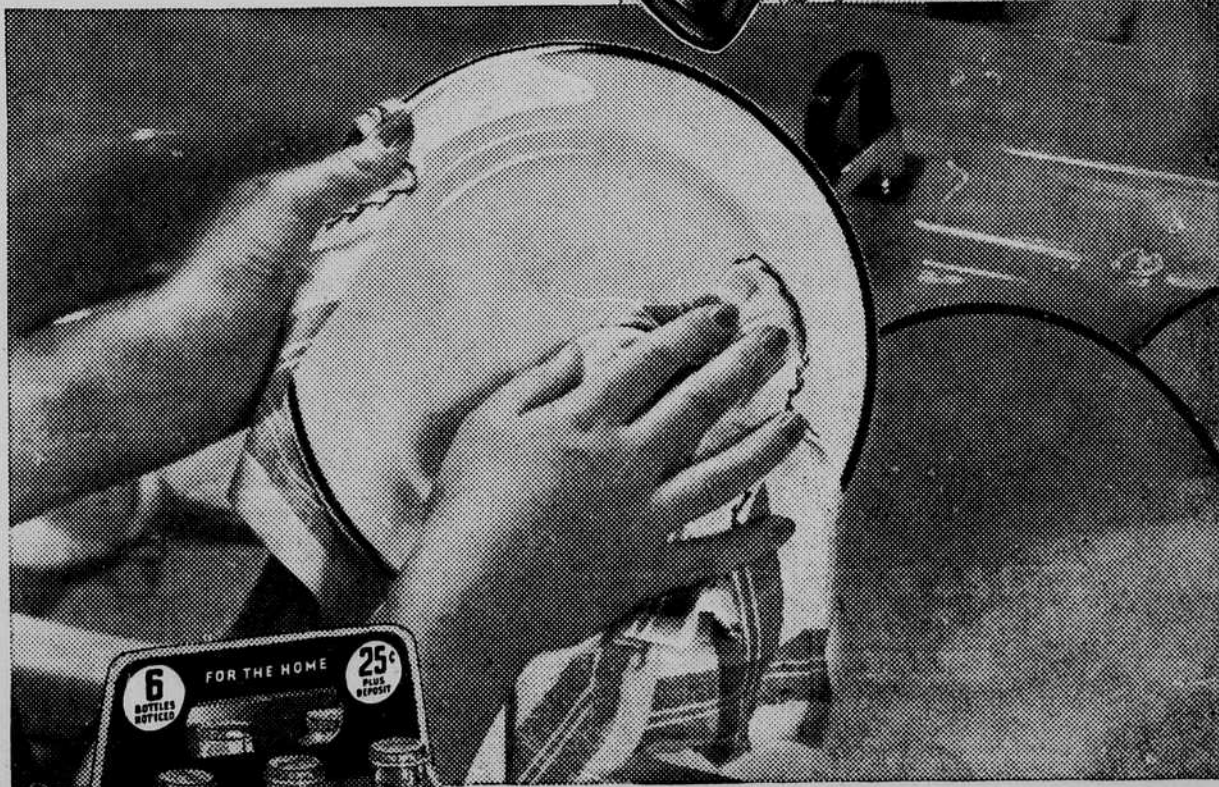
rating of Radioman, Seaman, or Fireman may be enlisted in the same rating held at the time of discharge. Those interested may write or apply in person to the nearest Recruiting Office which is located in Room 238 at the Post Office Building, Norfolk, Va.
