MARKET ENJOYS PEACE VISIONS

NEW YORK, Jan. 29.-(P)-Visions of peace apparently prompted the greater part of the buying, as well as the selling, in today's stock market and, while many armament-connected pivots backed water, low and medium-priced motors, packers and other specialties with good post-war prospects performed on the upside.

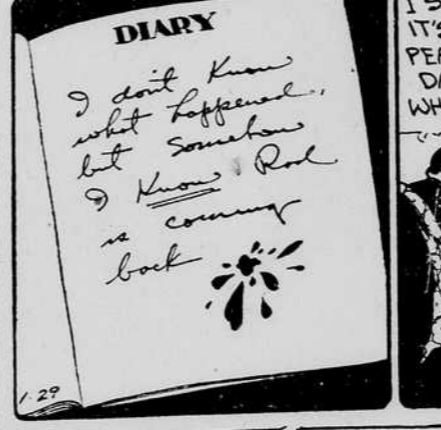
Trends dipped after a fairly active and steady opening but individual issues soon developed followings although activity slowed. Demand for junior favorites expanded briskly in the final hour and gains of fractions to a point or more were well distributed at the close.

The continued thrust of the Russians toward Berlin caused considerable shifting of accounts, especially from war-benefitted issues to those of companies that would encounter fewer transition difficulties with the return to normal times. Rails, with the exception of Delaware & Hudson which jumped 2 5/8 on dividend hopes, were on the outside throughout.

The Associated Press 60-stock average was unchanged at 59. Of 920 issues registering, 400 were up against 520 down or unchanged. Transfers totalled 1,374,050 shares compared with 1,254,730 Friday.

Bonds were irregularly lower at Chicago wheat was up 1-8 8/10 3-4 of a cent a bushel. Cotton was 20 to 35 cents a bale improved. In the Curb modest advances were recorded for American Macaracao, Colon Development and Pantepec. Turnover here was 522,460 shares versus 445,355 in the previous full session.
