**IN MANCHURIA.**  
 Consul Davidson's Experience of Four Months' Travel.  
 ST. PETERSBURG, Dec. 10.—James W. Davidson, United States consul at Tamsui, Formosa, who is here on his way home after four months of extensive travel in Manchuria, says that through the courtesy of Baron de Rosen, the Russian minister to Japan, he was provided with a special car when traveling on the Manchurian railway and that every facility was placed at his disposal by the Russian officials throughout his journey.  
 The reoccupation of Mukden by the Russians, Consul Davidson says, consisted only in the placing of forty guards at the gates.  
**CONDENSED DISPATCHES.**  
 The Russian government is said to be hurriedly preparing to meet the contingency of a general Armenian revolt in the Caucasus.  
 A strong Russian squadron has arrived at the port of Seoul, Korea, to prevent the opening of Yonampo to the world's commerce.  
 President Roosevelt has decided to appoint Thomas J. Alden, chairman of the Missouri Republican state committee, to be assistant United States treasurer at St. Louis.  
**A BLOODLESS BATTLE.**  
 Deputies and Strikers Shoot For Half an Hour Without Result.  
 TRINIDAD, Colo., Dec. 10.—While a number of deputies and clerks were driving from Berwind to Tobaccoe they were fired upon by several men hid behind rocks and brush. The deputies and clerks jumped from the wagon and returned the fire. The shooting continued at intervals for thirty minutes, though no one was injured.  
 Sheriff Clark and posse were preparing to leave for the scene on a special train when word was received that re-enforcements of guards had arrived from Tobaccoe, half a mile away, and the ambush party fled. No arrests were made. The trouble is said to have started when a miner came into the mine office at Berwind and became very abusive. He was kicked out by a deputy, and it is thought that he stirred up his friends to start the difficulty.  
**Soldier Shot Escaping Comrade.**  
 CHEYENNE, Wyo., Dec. 10.—Thomas Burton, a private in Company M, Second Infantry, was shot and dangerously wounded here by Private George Hood. Burton was dressed in citizen's clothes and is said to have been attempting to escape. The men were personal friends.
