# OYSTERS ARE BLAMED.

## Typhoid Fever in Orange Said to Have Come from Bivalves.

An outbreak of typhoid fever in Orange is believed to have been caused by contaminated oysters. Many cases reported from different sections of the city have been investigated by the Board of Health and it is declared the sufferers have been made ill by oysters procured from a bed lying in water tainted with typhoid bacilli.

The board does not hold the local dealers responsible for the outbreak, for the oysters were undoubtedly purchased by them from wholesalers in good faith. Secretary Schuler, of the board, gives it as his opinion that a number of oyster beds along the New Jersey coast should be abandoned at once because some of them are near the mouth of streams that are sewered into.

**A SMART WINTER SUIT.**  
A pretty suit for the winter months requires no trimming but velvet collar, cuffs and belt, the cloth being laid in folds, making a sufficient trimming of itself. The skirt is circular, with a deep pointed yoke in front, around the edge of which is laid three deep folds. The jacket, sleeves included, is made in the same way, with the deep point of folds coming down in the front and on the outside of the sleeves.
