WEEKLY REPORT OF WEATHER.

The weather during the week ending at 8 a. m., July 8, was generally favorable. The temperature was moderate and there was more than the usual amount of sunshine, with very little rain. The average temperature for the district—70 degrees—is 2 degrees lower than the mean for the preceding week and nearly 4 degrees lower than the July normal. The maximum temperatures were less than 90 degrees, as a rule, the highest reported being 92 degrees, at Canton, Salem county, on the 1st and 2d. The lowest temperature, 48 degrees, occurred at Marksboro, Warren county, on the 4th. The week closed with rising temperature.

The precipitation consisted of local showers and thunderstorms, occurring mostly on the 2d, and was much below the average over the greater part of the state. At a few stations, in Cape May, Hunterdon, Morris and Passaic counties, the showers and thunderstorms gave nearly the normal amounts of rain for the week, but at a majority of stations the rainfall was less than .25 of an inch, a few stations reporting inappreciable amounts. The greatest amounts reported were: 1.18 inches, at Cape May, Cape May county, and .90 of an inch at Boonton, Morris county.

On several days during the week the possible amount of sunshine was received and the average amount for the period, 80 per cent., was much above the normal.

A severe local storm, with a heavy fall of hail, occurred in the central part of Burlington county on the afternoon of the 7th, the storm being particularly severe in the vicinity of Mount Holly.

JOHN R. HEGEMAN LOSES

NEWARK, July 13.—In an opinion mailed to counsel Vice Chancellor Howell denies the application made by John R. Hegeman, president of the Metropolitan Insurance Company, of New York, for the appointment of a receiver for the Atlantic Rubber Shoe Company, of Cranston, R. I. a New Jersey corporation, organized in 1901 with \$10,000,000 authorized capital. Mr. Hegeman is the owner of 750 shares of preferred stock and 2,250 shares of common stock and his application for the receivership is based in his opinion to the resolution of dissolution voted for by two-thirds of the stockholders on May 8 last. He declares that the company is financially able to continue the business.

The vice chancellor pointed out in denying the application that the result of granting the application would be to "unseat the present directors for the reasons stated in the bill, and to appoint an indifferent person receiver to wind up the company's affairs."

The court said that it appeared in evidence that the defendant corporation "has in the bank much more than enough money to pay the full outstanding debts," and concluded that the court ought not to enjoin the corporation from the transaction of its necessary business or from accomplishing its dissolution.

The Atlantic company remained in business from May to December, 1904 when its board of directors decided that the process was a failure and voted to sell its plant in Cranston for \$135,000 in cash. The money is still in bank and against it is chargeable about \$12,000 in liabilities. The par value of the capital stock was then reduced, the preferred stock to \$20 a share and the common stock to \$4 a share.
