

COTTAGER AND WIFE DIE IN THIS CITY

State Commissioner of Banking and Insurance Grants Charter To Ventnor Trust Co.

The application of the Ventnor Trust Company to operate and do a banking business in this city has been acted upon favorably by State Commissioner of Banking and Insurance William E. Tuttle, Jr., he making his decision to grant them a charter known this week.

The Ventnor Trust Company has already leased temporary quarters in the new building at Victoria and Atlantic avenues and will open their institution there as soon as the many details necessary to the opening of a new bank are completed.

It has an authorized capital of \$100,000 with a surplus of \$40,000, and the following are the officers:

President, George Gumpert, President of City Council; vice-president, Joseph Jolly, Philadelphia brass manufacturer, and local cottager; secretary, Warner Lindsay, Jr., real estate; solicitor, William H. Smathers.

Some of the directors are: John Gibson, B. Frank Young, Freeman Parker, George T. Sale, Al Marsden, John McCoach, retired hotel man; James H. Perry, of the Philadelphia Life Insurance Co. Both of the latter are cottagers here.

This is the seventh Trust Company for Absecon Island and as there are six National Banks, makes the thirteenth bank of the Island.

The unparalleled growth of Ventnor City was one of the strong arguments given to the banking commissioner of the state that influenced him in his decision to grant a charter to another banking institution.
