The Foundation Club is enjoying its third year of successful existence, having been built on the ruins of a National Foundation project which was never realized. Before the plans for this club were destroyed the members of the intended local branch were well under way in their plans, under the direction of Miss Miller. With the undoubting foresight that, by means of co-operation civic projects could be accomplished here, the members did not disband but instead formed the organization which we know as the Foundation Club of Atlantic City.

With no other purpose than "getting together" and being of aid when opportunities arose the members of this club, in their own quiet and modest way, have accomplished a great deal.

Their success is partly due to the fact that matters are so arranged that members delight in attending the monthly meetings. With this interest desired action is never lacking.

The means are entirely original. Rather than the dreaded boring atmosphere of the usual formalities the ladies of the Foundation Club look forward to the surprises of the luncheon meetings which are held once a month. To quote the president, "the success of these affairs lies in the fact that they are so delightfully informal." No time or energy is ever spared to make each luncheon unique and different from the last. There is always that individual touch and decorations and favors are always such that they add flavor to the meetings. The purpose for the gatherings vary too. At a luncheon some time ago the members of the Council of Women's Organizations was invited and interest in the Detention Home project was revived.

When the Woman's Clubhouse was the main issue, again the Foundation Club came through with flying colors. With two successful card parties accomplished the members have been able to furnish an attractive board room. From the beginning the workers for the new house found earnest boosting from this club.

These examples show that the meetings are not purely social events but are built on some concrete idea. While the constitu-

tion does not bind the members to any other purpose than good-fellowship the many problems which continually arise are given the necessary attention.

The Foundation Club does much charity work. To mention this is in keeping with the season. And the club has done its share to cheer the poor and sick at Christmas time.

You can readily understand now why there has never been a call for members in this club. The ninety members have joined voluntarily and the ladies have no intention of revising this custom. The growth has been natural, with no changes in the qualifications to join.

The Foundation Club is undoubtedly due for a long term. A worth-while group like these active members could not have worked in vain. The members and officers are to be complimented on their accomplishments.
