REVENUE SCHEDULE "K"

The statement by leading Democratic congressmen that the first thing they will undertake in dealing with the tariff is to revise downward the wool schedule, better known as schedule "K," is not bringing them the hearty applause they expected from the Democratic press.

Chairman Underwood of the ways and means committee is quoted by the Associated Press as saying "While I have no authority to say that the wool growers will not be given a hearing, it is my opinion that they might just as well make an assault upon Gibraltar as upon the house."

The ways and means committee is supposed to be charged with the duty of devising ways and means to supply the government with needed revenue and to so adjust the taxes as not to discriminate against any class.

If wool is to be selected as one of the products for the free list, then why not sugar, rice, tobacco, hemp? Why not woollens, cotton manufactures, iron and steel, machinery and other revenue-producing imports?

Next to sugar, imports of wool and woollens produce more revenue than anything else. To put wool on the free list would decrease the revenues in many millions and the committee would have to find a way to obtain it from other sources.
