SUMMARY OF FACTS REGARDING COUNTY SCHOOL SYSTEM

County Superintendent of Schools A. B. Stroup Completes Annual Report. Brief Resume is Interesting.

The detailed facts and figures as to the condition of the Berland county schools for the school year ending July 1, 1911, are set forth in the report of County Superintendent of Schools A. B. Stroup.

At Albuquerque, N. M., July 21. (By Evening Herald City.) Gentlemen: I am just completing my report to the territorial superintendent for the year ending July 1, 1911 and it seems to me that the summary of the facts therein contained might be of interest to the people of this county.

We had on hand June 1, 1910, a balance of \$12,343.28. We reported off from the general school fund \$25,514.88, which was received from the following sources:

January, 1910, \$1,724.91; February, 1910, \$1,812.39; March, 1910, \$1,812.39; April, 1910, \$1,812.39; May, 1910, \$1,812.39; June, 1910, \$1,812.39.

Total receipts for year, \$89,224.00. Total, including balance, \$101,567.00. The different districts paid out as follows:

For teachers' wages, \$50,498.98; New buildings, grounds, \$1,155.41; Repairs, improvements, \$1,747.42; School supplies, \$1,225.18; Rent, \$1,225.18; Fuel, \$1,225.18; Interest, \$1,225.18; Expense collecting poll tax, \$265.96; Janitors and other employes, \$1,225.18; Salaries, including city superintendent, \$1,225.18; Miscellaneous, \$1,225.18.

Total, \$89,224.00. Balance, \$12,343.28. The amount of bonded indebtedness for the county for school purposes is \$38,950. The total value of school property is \$269,942. This report is for the whole county, including the city of Albuquerque.

Outside the city of Albuquerque there were employed 42 teachers. Of these, 48 were less than high school graduates, 29 were high school graduates only, and nine had normal training.
