GREATEST AIRSHIP FOR THE PANAMA EXPOSITION

Largest Dirigible Ever Constructed Will Cost \$250,000; First Round-the-World Air Flight to Start From Trieste.

San Francisco, Feb. 21.—The Panama-Pacific International exposition has made an agreement with the Zeppelin company of Hamburg, Germany, to operate a Paraxial dirigible at the exposition.

The dirigible will be the largest ever constructed, having a length of 450 feet and a width of 80 feet and will cost \$250,000. The dirigible, of whose design it will be used when an exhibition, will be portable, constructed in Germany at a cost of \$80,000. A gas plant will be built costing \$40,000. The dirigible will make trips of 500 miles length, carrying passengers at \$25 each. Two licensed crews of eight members in each crew, from Germany, will accompany the dirigible to America and operate it while at San Francisco.

When not making regular trips the dirigible will be on exhibition at the exposition. Here exposition visitors will have an opportunity to explore its spacious interior, composed of observation rooms, sleeping rooms, dining, kitchen, bath room, smoking room, reading room and all accessories that provide a modern transportation car with the comforts of travel.

The first round the world air flight is planned to start from the grounds of the exposition by May 1st. Airships from all the nations of civilization, in aircraft of every type, will contend for the largest prize fund ever offered in any sporting event in history. Three hundred thousand dollars will be distributed among the victors. The route will pass eastward across the American continent, the Atlantic, Europe, Russia, Asia and the Pacific ocean to Alaska, thence the flyers will proceed to San Francisco.

A time limit of ninety days is placed upon the contest, which will have the sanction of the Federation Aeronautique Internationale, the central organization of aeronautical bodies in every civilized country on the globe.

INDIAN CONFESSES KILLING AT ISLETA

Pablo Sandoval, alias Robinson Tells Officers He Shot Martin Marujo by Accident; Sabedra Bound Over.

Pablo Sandoval, who says his right name is Alexander Robinson, after having been bound over to the grand jury without bail yesterday afternoon by United States Commissioner Whiting, charged with murdering Martin Marujo, an aged Indian, at Isleta Thursday night, confessed that he shot the old Indian. All yesterday and until after the arraignment, Sandoval insisted that he did not do the shooting. But under close questioning he broke down and confessed. He claims that the shot was accidental. So far as is known there was no feeling between the two men.

Judge George R. Craig yesterday afternoon held Andres Sabedra to the grand jury, charged with the robbery of the Graham tailoring establishment. Sabedra went to jail in default of \$500 bond as did Tom Blasi, who pleaded guilty to receiving stolen goods and who was bound over in \$500 bond. Sabedra has been held in the county jail for some time while the case has been under investigation. He pleaded not guilty.

P. Giacomelli pleaded not guilty before Judge Craig yesterday afternoon to assault and battery charges brought by A. P. de Castelmoine and the case was set for hearing Tuesday. The complainant asked that Giacomelli be put under a bond to keep the peace.
