CLOVIS NEWSPAPER HAS JACK RABBIT CONTEST

Twenty-Five Hundred Ears Brought in by Curry County Hunters as Result of Competitive Extermination.

BARTH OF ALBUQUERQUE GIVES \$10 PRIZE

[Special Correspondence to the Herald] Clovis, N. M., March 6.—The Clovis Journal's jackrabbit scalp contest is over. What a slaughter it must have been! There were more than 1,250 scalps or 2,500 ears brought in to the Journal office at noon last Saturday when the "pelt" closed and the count began.

J. J. Braden of Clovis, who purchased a new shotgun a few weeks ago to use in the game, brought in exactly 415 scalps or 830 jackrabbit ears, which he alone killed within a radius of five miles of Clovis in about forty days.

State Senator Jesse Barth of Albuquerque whose attention was called to the scheme of ridding the country of the jackrabbits when he was over at our county fair last fall, offered \$10 in gold as the award which he desired should go to the one winning first in the Journal's contest.

Torrance County Town Proposes to Get Charter and Put on Metropolitan Airs.

The petitions, addressed to the board of county commissioners of Torrance county, are being numerously signed and will be ready for presentation within a few days.

Many benefits will accrue from having the town incorporated. At present the Business Men's association is powerless to act in affairs that would aid much in the improvement of the town.

A great factor will be the establishment of Willard's credit. This means much to a town, and would make it possible to erect an electric light plant, grade streets, establish sidewalk grades and build the sidewalks. M., March 7.—A cash prize of \$50 is proposed by the woman's auxiliary of the New Mexico board of exposition managers for the best motion picture scenario on the history of New Mexico. SACRAMENTO MAN WINS HARRIMAN SAFETY MEDAL. William Schwab Awarded Notable Trophy in Railroad World for Most Practical Safety Suggestions.

Los Angeles, Cal., March 6.—To William Schwab, conductor on the Sacramento division of the Southern Pacific company, has been awarded the replica in bronze of the Harriman memorial safety medal given by the American Museum of Safety to the employes in the operating of the winning road who was most conspicuous in the promotion of safety by suggestions and otherwise.
