PRESIDENT CABLES CALL FOR A SPECIAL SESSION; REPUBLICANS TO CONFER

Senator Lodge Issues Summons for G. O. P. Gathering to Perfect Senate Organization, To Be Held May 14; Republican House Leaders to Meet Three Days Later; Date of Opening of Congress Comes As Surprise

WASHINGTON, May 7.—President Wilson (cabled a call by cable today for a special session of congress to meet Monday, May 19. Secretary Trumbull is making the announcement and it would be impossible, of course, for the president to be here on the opening day. The day fixed for the special session was much earlier than Democratic leaders had expected.

White House officials said that in naming an early date for the session, President Wilson was guided largely by the advice of Secretary Glavin as to the necessity of passing annual appropriation measures which failed in the closing days of the last session.

There was no information at the white house as to the probable time of the return of the president, but concentration leaders believe the president will call the session earlier than had been anticipated in order that congress might discuss the most important appropriation measures before the treaty was ready for consideration.

OFFICIAL SUMMARY OF THE 80,000-WORD PEACE TREATY HANDED TO GERMANY TODAY

Paris, May 7.—The treaty of peace between the treaty-signing allied and associated powers on the one hand and Germany on the other, was handed to the German plenipotentiaries at Versailles today.

GERMANY MUST MAKE REPARATION; 35,782 SQUARE MILES TO BE GIVEN UP BY ENEMY

Amount of Indemnity Germany Must Pay Not Fixed, But Terms Indicate That Heavy Penalty Is to Be Exact; Alsace-Lorraine Part of East Prussia, Saar Basin, Danzig Region and South-eastern Tip of Silesia To Be Taken Away From Huns; China Not to Sign Treaty If Japan Gets Shantung Rights.

PARIS, May 7.—The German delegates to the peace congress declare that they will sign the peace treaty, but that Germany will not pay an indemnity.

In the discussion of peace terms by Germany through both her official and unofficial spokesmen she has invariably drawn a distinction between reparation and indemnity, construing the latter in effect as punitive damages.

DRASTIC terms are embodied in the treaty presented to the German plenipotentiaries today. The enemy must relinquish over 35,000 square miles of territory, pay such indemnity as a later commission will fix, and use his own economic resources to rebuild the lands he devastated during the war.

Alsace-Lorraine is restored to France, Poland gets the Posen district and part of Silesia and East Prussia, and France is given the Saar basin, as recompense for the wanton destruction of her coal mines by German troops.

An initial reimbursement for civilian damages, Germany agrees to make a payment of 20,000,000,000 marks (\$5,000,000,000) subsequent payments to be secured by bonds to be issued at the discretion of the reparation commission.

Germany, by the terms of the treaty, is ordered to deliver the Kaiser for trial.
