5th. Owing to the recent organization of a territorial association for the discharge of general and executive work such as has heretofore fallen upon the larger organizations as the Northern Central and Lincoln county associations...

6th. By disorganizing the Central Association and organizing into four local associations as suggested, the territory now embraced within the limits of this association will obtain a representation of eight in the executive committee of the territorial association instead of two.

For these reasons, your executive committee deemed it best at our meeting held just previous to the annual meeting, to suggest and recommend the action afterwards taken by the association at its annual spring meeting, March 16, 1886.

We also have to report that your executive committee have very thoroughly examined into the account of receipts and expenditures of Mr. G. L. Brooks as secretary and treasurer of the association...

By the action of the association at their regular meeting, call are made for the cattle men of Bernalillo and Valencia counties to meet at Albuquerque, Monday, April 5th...

Round ups for the spring and summer will also be arranged at these meetings and your committee urgently requests a full attendance.

The meeting at Albuquerque will be called to order by President H. M. Atkinson, if he be present, or by either J. A. Stinson or W. A. Hulvey, members of the executive committee.

The meeting at Socorro will be called to order by Secretary G. L. Brooks.

In conclusion, your committee beg to say that they have, to the best of their ability, discharged the duties imposed upon them and that they will continue to so act until the affairs of the association are wound up to the credit and honor of all concerned.
