The Sierra County Republican Convention will meet at the Court House in Hillsborough, at 1:30 o'clock p. m., Wednesday October 6th 1886, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the different county offices to be filled at the ensuing election: Consisting of a Representative for Grant and Sierra counties in the territorial assembly.

The Rio Grande Republican published at Las Cruces, where the district court is now in session says:

"Most of the forenoon was taken up with the argument of a motion to dismiss a suit brought for collection of the forfeited bond of June L. Fuller.

MONDAY. The case of the U. S. vs. June L. Fuller charged with having stolen a registered letter containing \$800 while postmaster at Hillsboro in 1884 was reached. It will be remembered that the grand jury refused to find a bill in this case and that June Fuller was tried and convicted on information filed by Gen. Adams, who was then post-office inspector for this district.

TUESDAY AND WEDNESDAY the cases occupied the attention of the court and the jury brought in a verdict of guilty. The case will be appealed to the supreme court.

CAPTAIN LAWTON, who is a brave and honest officer, admits in an interview in San Antonio that Lieutenant Gatewood, of the 6th cavalry, captured Geronimo. Gatewood, who is as modest as a girl, would never make the claim, and it is fortunate for his reputation that Captain Lawton is not afflicted with those petty jealousies that so often disfigure the character of army officers.
