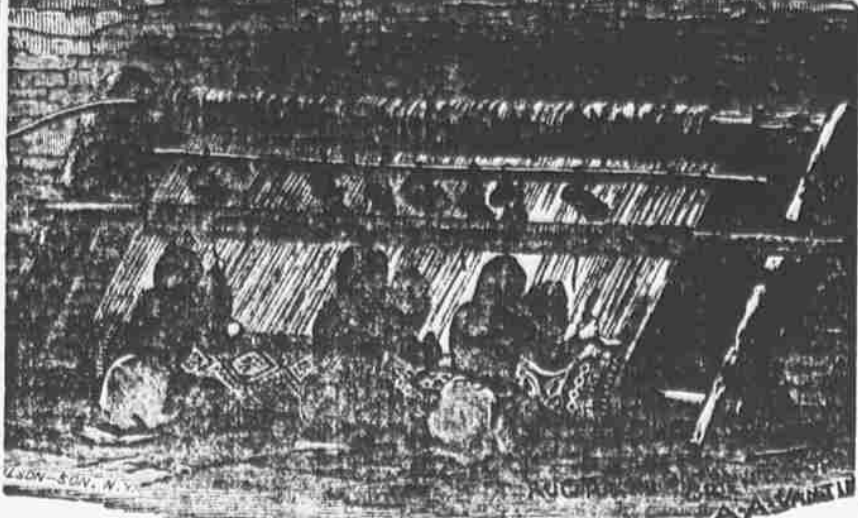


A GOLD BRICK AND AN INDIAN

TAXATION OF BANK SHARES. The U. S. Supreme Court agrees with the Court of Appeals in the Palmer Case. Martin T. McManis, as Receiver of Taxes, endeavored to collect from Francis A. Palmer, as a shareholder in the National Broadway Bank, a tax of \$4,954.63, assessed in 1981 on his bank stock, valued at \$100,000. Of this tax Mr. Palmer neglected to pay \$4,634.63. Under section 877 of the Consolidation act the Court of Common Pleas granted an order directing Mr. Palmer to show cause why he should not be punished for misconduct for neglecting and refusing to pay the tax. Notifying of the March Four. San Francisco, March 8.—A meeting of citizens was held yesterday afternoon to devise means for aiding unemployed workmen. Several prominent citizens denounced a sensational dispatch sent to Washington by persons styling themselves a committee, representing that there was starvation in San Francisco, and asking that Government relief be issued. The speakers, while admitting that there was much distress among the poor, expressed the opinion that the municipality was fully able to afford the necessary relief. A resolution was adopted to the effect that a subscription should be started and devoted to employing laborers in Golden Gate Park. The sum of \$2,750 was raised to pay laborers at the rate of \$1.50 per day.
