The first thing to do is to get a fresh egg: then take its size into consideration, as there are many sizes in eggs. Put enough cold water in pan to cover the egg, and put pan where it will reach the boiling point in about three minutes, which can easily be done on a gas stove. If the egg is very small take right out on a tablespoon as soon as water starts to bolf. If the egg is soft boiled and ready for eating. Go according to size, but do not let an egg boil longer than two minutes unless it is a duck egg—that is if you want a soft boiled egg.

Then take them from the fire and allow cold water to run ever them for a minute or twe. This will loosen the shell from the egg.
