Position Held by Wilson.
The position which this Government took with respect to submarine warfare after the Sussex disaster and which it still maintains, according to Secretary Lansing, is clearly outlined in these passages from the President's note bearing upon the Sussex case:
"it has now become painfully evident to the Government of the United States that the position which it took at the very outset is inoperative, namely, the use of submarines for the purpose of attacking the commerce of other nations, because of the very character of the vessels employed and the very method of their employment. It is of course, of course, utterly incompatible with the principles of humanity, the long established and incontrovertible rights of the neutral nations, the sacred rights of commerce, the sacred rights of immunity of noncombatants.
"it is still the purpose of the Imperial Government to prosecute relentlessly and indomitably warfare against the vessels of commerce by the use of submarines without regard to what the Government of the United States must consider the sacred and indisputable rules of international law and the universally recognized dictates of humanity, the Government of the United States is not forced to do so, but it is one course it can pursue. Unless the Imperial Government should now immediately declare an effectual abandonment of its present methods of submarine warfare (sinking merchantmen without warning) against passenger and freight carrying vessels, the Government of the United States can have no choice but to sever diplomatic relations with the German Empire altogether."
