Brooklyn Bridge Promenade Made Free to the Public. Last Pennies Taken in at Midnight—This Morning's Scenes.

The Brooklyn Bridge promenade is free. This may not seem like a very important matter, but an Evening World man, crossing the bridge to Brooklyn at 2 o'clock, and doing the mile and a quarter in sixteen minutes, met no less than 1,648 Brooklynites trailing over the big span to work, to play, to shop and to visit.

That meant \$16,480 paid to the Brooklynites in sixteen minutes. There were eager, bustling office boys, with neat bundles of lunch upon their arms; pretty and pert salesgirls, typewriters and lawyers' amanuenses, with the bloom of health on their round cheeks and sparkling in their bright eyes; waiters, chambermaids, bookkeepers and butlers; Irish, English, Italian, Chinese, and, in fact, all the tribes of comers were represented in the hurrying or dallying throng, and the promenade ried with lower Broadway at its busiest hour in the number of pedestrians on various bridges.

The law making the promenade free went into effect at midnight, and the event was made the occasion for a typical metropolitan demonstration. There were more than one hundred people gathered at the New York entrance at that hour, and I double that number at the Brooklyn end, waiting for the signal.
