

### Metropolitan Opera Season Opens to Crowded House

#### Black and White Gowns in the Boxes and New People in the Stalls Now Conducive to Brilliance —"Un Ballo in Mas- chera" Well Sung.

M. GATTI-CABAZZA began the seventh season of his management of the Metropolitan Opera Company last night with a presentation of Verdi's "Un Ballo in Maschera." There was a crowded house, an excellent performance and, upon the surface, a repetition of the familiar scenes of an opening night of the opera. Outside the faithful standers began to gather before sunset and the limit of admission had been exhausted long before the curtain rose. As far as the box-office was concerned the seating capacity of the house had been sold out days ago. Inside the lobby were congested with devotees renewing acquaintance who delayed taking their seats. The lights were turned down to top-heavy galleries ballasted down stairs by congested spaces behind the rail, while the boxes were empty and the orchestra floor little more than half filled. Mr. Toscanini's entrance to the orchestra pit, ten minutes late, brought forth applause which, strange to say, he acknowledged graciously. By the beginning of the second act every place was filled and the season was launched.

#### LEGINSKA PLAYS AN ALL CHOPIN PROGRAMME.

Few artists dare, of their own accord, to drop their Christian names, but Leginska, the English pianist, who gave a recital at Aeolian Hall yesterday afternoon, is one of those who do. We heard her last year and liked her and we like her better now. She not only plays with technical mastery, but she has imagination and temperament and sentiment that reaches and appeals. Her programme, yes, all Chopin, was enjoyed by a large audience. Her pronunciation of the sonata in B flat major, opus 15, was most impressive. Before and after this she played the twelve études, opus 10, and the twelve études, opus 10, Leginska may be forgiven the absence of a Christian name and the use of an unlighted cigarette, in the Padreswaki, by her refusal to add extra numbers to her programme.
