

### ROBBERS HOLD UP RUM TRUCK AT CITY HALL IN HOBOKEN

Seize Five Barrels of Whiskey in Front of Police Headquarters.

Three men in a touring car stole five barrels of whiskey directly in front of Hoboken City Hall, which houses Police Headquarters, late yesterday afternoon.

The truck was moving along at a good rate when the motor car drew alongside and one of the men in it halted the driver, Joseph Santaniello, No. 5 Centre Market Place, Manhattan. He was ordered to stop his vehicle.

At the same time another man got out of the automobile threw back his coat to display a badge, and directed Santaniello to descend from his seat.

"Say, you think you're getting away with murder, don't you?" the man asked.

Santaniello, dismayed by the badge, made no reply. Then he was commanded to get into the touring car, while the man with the badge climbed to the truck seat and started off with all the speed the heavy vehicle could muster. The automobile also drove off and half a mile out of Hoboken it was slowed down. Santaniello was made to get out. Then it went on.

### MOTORISTS SEE MAN TAKE DEATH PLUNGE

Leaps From Willis Avenue Bridge to Abutment 60 Feet Below.

An unidentified man about twenty years old last night jumped from the Willis Avenue Bridge, which extends over the Harlem River from 125th Street and First Avenue to 124th Street and Southern Boulevard.

Automobilists crossing the bridge heard the man utter a cry and saw him throw his cap to the roadway, mount the rail and jump off. He struck an abutment at the base of the bridge sixty feet below and rolled into the river.

Patrolman Thomas Gleason of the 120th Street Station was called by the bridge tender, Michael Rafferty, of No. 304 East 125th Street, and notified the Harbor Squad, which searched for the body.

### PINCHOT CAMPAIGN MAIL FOUND DUMPED IN CREEK.

Post Office Department Starts Inquiry After Large Bundles of Cards Are Found.

PHILADELPHIA, May 25.—Discovery of large bundles of Pinchot advertising in Mahanoy Creek, Schuylkill County, which was reported to the Post Office Department, resulted today in an investigation by Federal Post Office inspectors, which is expected to lead to several arrests.

The advertising was mailed at Philadelphia. Approximately 2,500,000 post cards were sent out by the Pinchot Campaign Committee from May 8 to 12. Local committees were advised the cards had been mailed and were asked to check up on delivery dates.

After word came from Girardville, Schuylkill County, close to the home of State Senator Robert D. Heaton, that the cards had not been delivered, large bundles were found in Mahanoy Creek. Post Office inspectors to-day could attach no blame to the local Post Office authorities.

Girardville is in State Treasurer Snyder's home county, which, despite frantic efforts by Aalter supporters, was carried by the forester.

### MADE SURE OF DEATH BY GAS.

Alfred Leonard, twenty-two years old, of No. 1860 Eighth Avenue, was found dead in his home last night with a tube from a gas jet in his mouth and a carpet bag pulled over his head. Emil Leonard, his father, returning home, noticed an odor of gas and discovered his son's body.

### U. S. WOULD DISCUSS WATERWAYS TREATY

Secretary Hughes Gives Out Word Note Has Been Sent to British.

WASHINGTON, May 25.—An announcement issued to-day, by Secretary Hughes, is as follows:

"The Secretary of State, on May 17, 1922, sent to the British Ambassador a note stating that the United States Government would be glad to take up with the Canadian Government the negotiation of a treaty looking to deepening of the waterway which would enable ocean-going ships to reach the Great Lakes.


"The department understands that this note has been forwarded to the Canadian Government. No answer has as yet been received."

### HEAVY SENTENCES IN DRY LAW CASES

Three Years in Prison and \$11,000 Fines for Former Attorney.

CINCINNATI, May 25.—George E. Remus, former Chicago attorney, and seven associates, sentenced last week to Federal Penitentiary on charges of conspiracy to violate the Volstead act, were found guilty of maintaining a nuisance on the Dater farm, near here, in United States District Court late last night. It was charged that large quantities of liquor had changed hands illegally at the farm.

Judge Peck immediately passed sentence, Remus getting the maximum, one year in jail and a fine of \$1,000 and costs. The others were given lesser jail sentences and each was fined. As a result of the two convictions, Remus will serve three years and pay fines of \$11,000.
