PARIS, May 6.—A compromise of the interrelated views for the amelioration of the international exchange rate situation was effected this evening at a session of the interparliamentary commercial conference when Sir Watson Rutherford, for fifteen years a Liverpool member of the House of Commons, introduced and carried after a long debate a resolution which is now expected to give direction to the allied financiers in their Brussels conference.

Sir Watson's project will not be made public before the special session of the conference at the Sarbonne tomorrow, but in an interview with the correspondent of THE SUN AND NEW YORK HERALD he expressed confidence that it would be more acceptable than the plans by either Walter Behrens or Baron Descamps, authors of the British and the Belgian schemes, respectively.
