

INSPECTOR HENRY'S STOCK DEALS BARED

Counsel for Brokers Explains Firm 'Carried' Accused as Other Good Customers.

CHARGED OFF THE DEBT

Holdover March Grand Jury Told of Transactions Covered in Indictment.

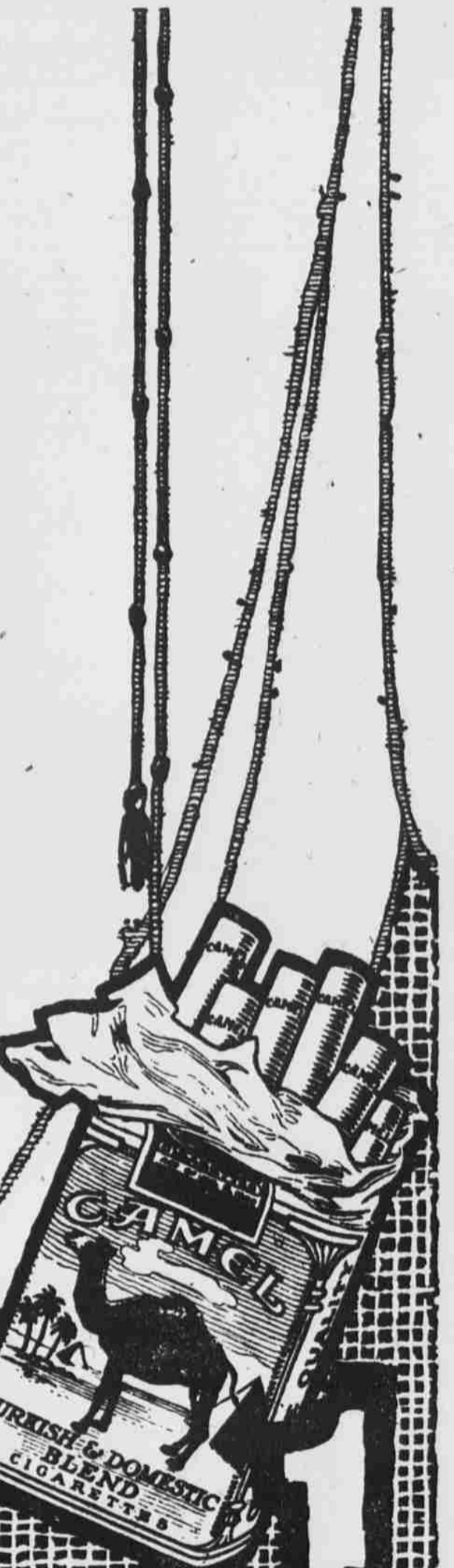
