

DENY BRITISH SEEK RUSSIAN ADVANTAGE

Nothing Significant in Meeting of Lloyd George and Krassin, Statement Says.

FRENCH FULLY INFORMED

Moscow Gold Will Not Enter Into Trade Problem, Another Assertion.

Special Cable Despatch from The Sun and New York Herald, June 3, 1920.

London, June 2.—It was stated in high quarters here today that there was nothing in the meeting between Lloyd George and Krassin, the Soviet Minister of Trade, or in Krassin's other negotiations in the English capital to justify the statement that the British are moving faster than the other Allies or are doing anything to reference to Russia in warrant violation.

This statement, it is believed, was directed at certain dispatches from Paris to the British press, particularly to the Daily Express, picturing France as worried concerning Krassin's negotiations with British officials. As for the actual negotiations, it is pointed out, they are conducted in strict accord with the San Remo resolutions and through the interallied Economic Commission. So far as Lloyd George's reception of Krassin is concerned it is stated that it was due solely to the Premier's desire to obtain first hand information.

It is also stated authoritatively that Lloyd George did not arrange to see the Soviet Minister until Mr. Millerand had expressed to him the French view, which was favorable. The Paris Government's instructions to Mr. Paul Cambon, French Ambassador in London, not to attend any meeting in which Krassin took part were not taken in Downing Street as being in any sense unfriendly or critical.

As a result of Krassin's first meeting with the Economic Council today it was stated on good authority that it is unlikely that the question of the utilization of the Moscow gold will enter into the consideration of the committee.

It is also stated that the only of raw materials and manufactured products in kind. The use of a small amount of gold to finance the initial operations is expected, but the object is to obtain raw material from Russia in exchange of manufactured goods from the Allies.

The results of the first conference are considered to indicate that Krassin has convinced the allied experts who questioned him that Russia has enough material at least to begin business. At the same time the public is cautioned not to expect a steady reduction of prices here, for it is pointed out that if wheat and flour are imported from Russia the British market must export to that country a like amount of clothing and railway material.

According to well informed persons, plans for resuming commercial relations with Russia have progressed so far as to include the provision of interallied commissions to supervise these trades in kind at Odessa, Rostov and other ports on the Baltic and Black seas.

Paris, June 2.—The Temps says today it learns from a highly authoritative source in London that negotiations between Gregory Krassin and officials of the British Government for a resumption of trade relations will last quite some time. Krassin, according to the Temps informant, is not a plenipotentiary and will have to consult the Moscow Government on the decisions arrived at.

Representatives of Great Britain, Belgium, Denmark, Spain, Holland, Norway, Sweden and Switzerland will meet in conference here June 15 for the purpose of establishing a common plan of action for the protection of foreign creditors of Russia.

REFUSES PASSPORTS TO ENTER RUSSIA

State Department Turns Down Request of Chamber.

Washington, June 2.—Informal request of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States for passports for a commission to enter Russia to study problems concerning the resumption of trade with that country, has been refused by the State Department.

Officials explained that the consistent attitude of the Department has been to refuse all requests from travelers and commercial agents seeking to enter Russia.

BARRACKS SAVED IN 2 HOUR BATTLE

Police Sergeant Shot in Clash Out of Belfast.

BELFAST, June 2.—A concerted attack was made on the Grosvenor Barracks, County Down, twenty-one miles from Belfast. Efforts were made to blow up the building. After two hours during which there were hot exchanges between the attacking party and the police, the available weapons were exhausted. The police sergeant who was shot and is in a critical condition.

LARA, Kings County, Ireland, June 2.—The police barracks here and at ... will were attacked early today, but without success. The fusillades of the attacking party lasted several hours. The roadways leading to both villages were blocked with trees, while the railway railway line had been torn up.

TRALE, Ireland, June 1.—Raiders after a two-hour fight with the police at Fintona, County Kerry, captured the barracks without bloodshed. The raiders fled on the approach of soldiers from a torpedo boat destroyer. A sergeant and a constable were wounded.

HOME RULE BILL MAKES PROGRESS

Minor Amendments Made to Several Clauses.

LONDON, June 2.—The House of Commons, considering the home rule bill in committee, adopted clauses four, five and six without important amendment. Only two noteworthy points were raised, the first, an amendment proposing to omit the sub-section reserving to the Imperial Parliament control of the armed forces, which was negatived with division; the second, the clause in the bill empowering the constitution of a separate postal service for Ireland in the event of the two Irish parliaments agreeing to unite. This division was opposed by Sir Edward Carson and many members of both sides of the House, and eventually the Government agreed to reconsider the matter at a later stage.

Clauses seven and eight were adopted, the Government accepting Sir Edward Carson's amendment providing that the seats of Government should be in Dublin and Belfast, or such other places as the Irish parliaments themselves should determine.

ITALIAN CHAMBERS AWAIT SPA MEETING

Open Till Nitti Goes; May Re-open After Conference.

ROME, June 1.—Failure to accept the proposal of Premier Nitti to postpone the approaching conference between the members of the Supreme Council and the German leaders at Spa resulted today in a decision to keep Parliament in session for a maximum of ten days, as Signor Nitti must leave Rome not later than June 14 in order to reach Spa in time for the conference.

It was decided to reserve the right to reopen Parliament when the Spa meeting is concluded. The Governor of Sicily says that confirmation has been received of a wish of former Premier Orlando to abandon his position as President of the Chamber of Deputies. Signor Orlando desires to return to his seat as a Deputy in the Chamber and participate again in active political life.
