HUNGARIAN CABINET DECIDES TO REMAIN

GIOLITTI LIKELY TO BE ITALY'S PREMIER

Summoned, With Others, by King to Discuss Crisis.

ROME, June 10.—King Victor Emmanuel, following the resignation of the Nitti Ministry, called to the palace the former Foreign Minister Tommaso Tittoni, the President of the Senate, ex-Premier Orlando, who resigned yesterday from the Presidency of the Chamber of Deputies, ex-Premier Giolitti, Lanzetta and Salandra, Luigi Meda, former Minister of Finance, and Signor Rossi, Vice-President of the Chamber of Deputies, and discussed with them the "cabinet crisis."

BRITISH MINERS VOTE AGAINST COERCION

Want Unions to Stop Handing Munitions for Ireland.

LONDON, June 10.—Under the presidency of Robert Smillie, the Miners' Federation held a conference in Memorial Hall today and decided to formulate a demand for an increase in wages, as a share of the increase in the price of coal.

TRIBESMEN SLAY BRITISH AT TELFAR

Massacre Officers, Officials and Townsmen.

LONDON, June 10.—Two British officers, all the Government officials and a number of townsmen were killed in an attack by Shammar tribesmen on Telfar near Mosul, Asiatic Turkey, according to Baghdad advices coming by way of Bombay.

ABANDON PLEBISCITE IN EASTERN SILESIA

Inter-Allied Commissioners Give Up Mandate.

BRUNNEN, June 10.—The Interallied Plebiscite Commission in Eastern Silesia has returned its mandate to the Supreme Council on the ground that the task cannot be fulfilled under the prescribed conditions, according to reports here today.

CENSORSHIP AGAIN IN ITALY AND RUMANIA

Poland Likely to Get Help in Fight Against Soviets.

WASHINGTON, June 10.—Complete censorship has been established in Italy and Rumania, according to official dispatches received here today.

IRISH UNIONS WON'T HANDLE MUNITIONS

Railwaymen and Dockers Say Army Can't Force Them.

DUBLIN, June 10.—A manifesto pledging support for the Dublin railwaymen and dockers in their refusal to handle munitions has been issued by the executive of the Irish Labor party and Trade Union Congress. The manifesto denies the King and the British Government, saying:

SEBS SPURN AUSTRIAN MONEY

POLAND EXPECTED TO SEND PEACE NOTE

But Warsaw Report Was Contradicted in Paris.

WARSAW, June 9 (delayed).—Poland will send a peace note to the Russian Soviet Government within a few days, according to newspapers here. The report will be handled by Premier Shulski (who has now resigned office), who is empowered by Diet leaders to act in behalf of the Government, which denied its new note on June 4.

French Merchant Fleet Grows

Paris, June 10.—During discussion of the merchant marine budget in the Chamber of Deputies today Paul Bignon, Under-Secretary for Marine, reported that the French merchant fleet, which previous to the war comprised 2,550,000 tons, would soon reach a total of 3,550,000 tons despite the losses suffered during the conflict.

GEN. PORTER SERIOUSLY ILL

Grant's Former Aid, 85, Had to Undergo Operation.

Gen. Horace Porter, who was aide de camp to Gen. Grant and later Ambassador to France, is seriously ill in his home at 27 Madison avenue. It was learned last night. It was stated, however, that his physicians and members of his family still have hope for his recovery. He is 85 years old.
