

DE VALERA WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE U. S.

Friends of Irish Freedom Charge 'Meddling' With American Politics.

JUSTICE COHALAN ANGRY

Blame for Lack of Erin Plank in G. O. P. Platform Laid to 'President.'

Friction between Eamon De Valera, 'President' of the unrecognized Irish republic, and the more conservative supporters of Irish independence here reached the point of an open break yesterday.

One delegate pointed out this would paralyze all Irish industries and lead to civil war.

It is intended to present to the Democratic Convention the plank that De Valera is said to have blocked in Chicago.

At this point Mr. De Valera and Mr. Walsh are said to have injected themselves into the situation.

Should Mr. Walsh decide to pick up the third party banner friends of his here said they believed he would have the support of a large part of organized labor because of his efforts for workmen as a member of the War Labor Board.

In today's issue of the Gaelic American John Devoy, its editor, charges that \$50,000 of the funds subscribed for bonds of the Irish Republic were used to send to Chicago a "handwritten" agreement of individuals who used everything that Justice Cohalan had accomplished toward getting an Irish plank into the Republican platform.

MONOPLANE OFF TO WEDDING. Aircraft Starts for Omaha for Aerial Ceremony.

The all metal monoplane J. L. 6, with Bertie Acosta at the controls, took off yesterday at Central Park, L. I., on the way to Omaha, Neb., with a wedding cake three feet in diameter and eighteen inches high as the principal freight.

Aboard were John M. Larsen of 461 Riverside Drive, who imported the plane from Germany; Charles F. Hedden and a mechanic. The plane will stop at Buffalo, Dayton, Ohio, where Col. Gilmore of the Air Service will be picked up, and at Chicago, where Capt. Eddie Rickman, leading American ace, will join the party.

At Omaha a young couple, friends of Mr. Larsen, will be married in the plane. The return trip will be made without a stop.

THREATENS TO CLOSE IRISH RAILWAYS

Lloyd George Refuses to Discontinue Sending Troops.

LONDON, June 18.—Premier Lloyd George today received a deputation of railway men in a conference which lasted almost three hours.

This, declared Mr. Thomas, leaves the question of the strike of Irish railwaymen untouched, but the Government announced that should the strikers persist in refusing to carry troops and munitions, the Government would close the railways, which would lead to a very serious situation.

HUTCHINS EXTRADITED.

Writ Granted in Case of Alleged Swindler of Idaho Man.

At the hearing, Hutchins, who is under heavy bail, was identified by the wife of Norris as the man who had robbed her husband last winter.

INCENDIARY KEEPS FIREMEN ON HOP

Starts Six Early Morning Fires on East Side.

An incendiary who stayed awake all night and set five fires between 3 and 5 o'clock yesterday, took a short nap, had breakfast, and set a sixth which cost small damage but added to the terror of the lower East Side and to the overworked firemen.

The other fires were at 55 Rose street, 77 Roosevelt street, 85 Cherry street, 14 Hamilton street and 15 Eldridge street.

Deputy Chief Helm said he believed the incendiary watched the progress of each of the fires, and as the firemen finished their work ran to set another.

Henry Helm, Deputy Fire Chief, after visiting each of the fires said there was no doubt a fire bug set the blaze.

Each case kerosene had been poured on waste in the rear woodsheds. Only one of the fires, that at 37 Roosevelt street, proved stubborn.

Narrow hallways prevented the alarmed tenants making a quick exit, and as it was a six story tenement not all could get out the fire escapes at once.

When handling the half-dressed tenants to the street and trying to get hose lines in, the firemen had a hard time. Several of them were overcome. The loss was about \$1,000. None of the tenants was injured.
