

ELWELL CRIME LAID TO OLD LOVE NOTES

Turkman Said to Have Had Letters Compromising a Woman Now Married. REFUSED TO YIELD THEM Suspected Killer Is Believed to Have Succeeded at Second Attempt.

Although official investigators were unable to report progress yesterday in their efforts to solve the mystery surrounding the slaying of Joseph Bowring Elwell. It was said that private detectives working upon the case are proceeding along what they believe to be a "warm trail."

This has to do with Elwell's relations with a young woman, now married and living outside the jurisdiction of the District Attorney of New York county. These private detectives are said to have unearthed evidence that Elwell had come into possession of a packet of letters of a somewhat compromising nature belonging to this young woman, and that he had them in his house at the time of his death.

Inquiry made at the District Attorney's office about this packet brought neither affirmation nor denial. It was among the dead man's effects. It would provide a motive for the slaying that would be in line with one of the first theories advanced regarding the white slayer had called with the intention of forcing Elwell to surrender something or of killing him if he refused.

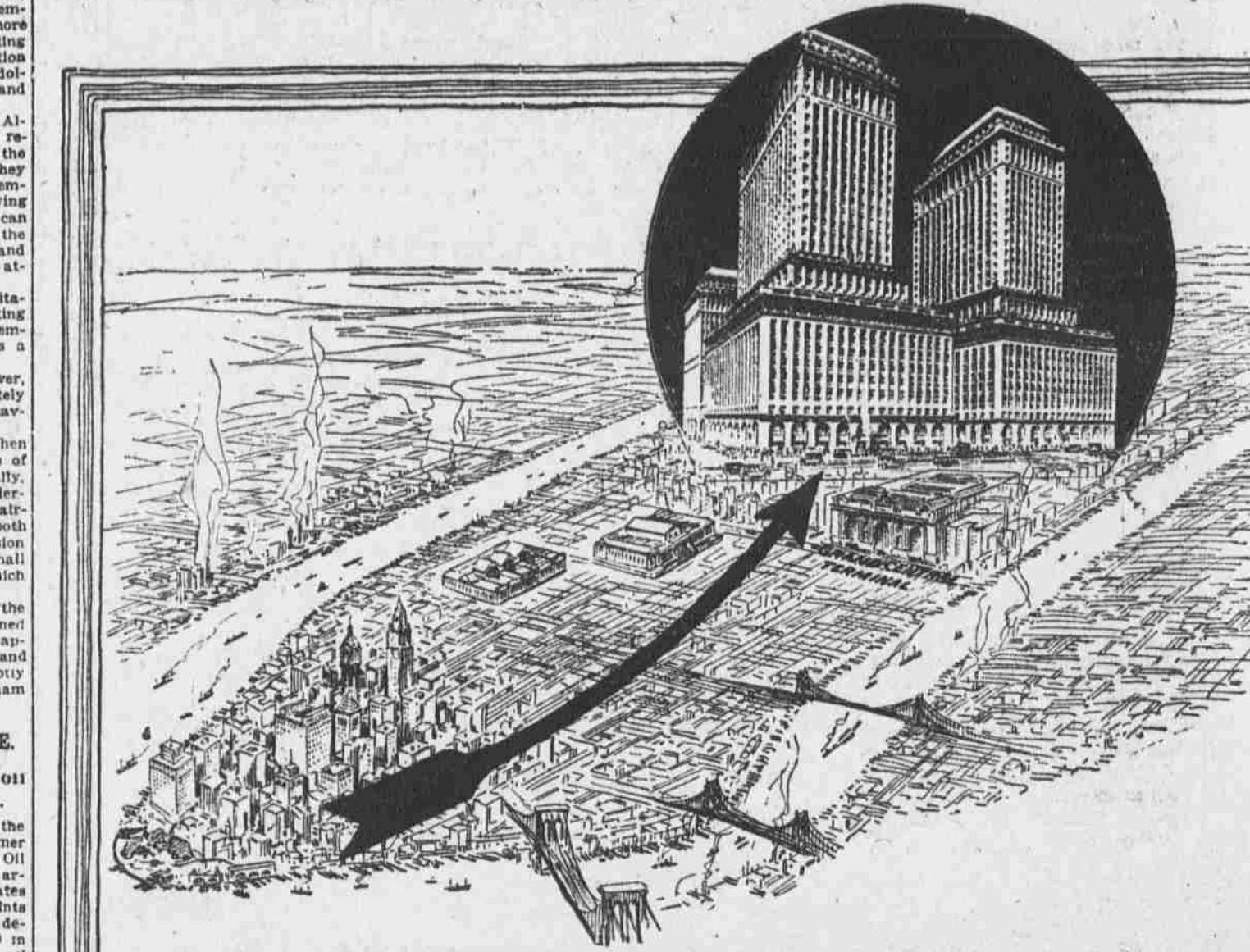

Big Business Is Moving Uptown
