RECOGNITION BY U. S. MAY FOLLOW LATER Army Men See Hope of Defeating Reds in Russia.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 11.—Hopes of military experts here of the establishment within Russia of a force that might successfully combat the Bolsheviki were strengthened today by the announcement of France's decision to give de facto recognition to Gen. Wrangel as the head of the South Russian Government.

State Department officials were unwilling to comment as to whether the American note which might be brought to bear upon the Soviet Government should determine to demand impossible peace terms from Poland.

London, Aug. 11.—The power of the United States to extend aid is greatly limited under the law without approval of Congress, although it is expected the Government would find means to do what it wants to do.
