

**ZAMORA IS ROUTED,  
AMERICANS ESCAPE**

Jalisco Bandit Defeated in Four Hour Fight and Troops Flee.

**REPORTS OF FILIBUSTER**

Alleged Band From United States Driven Back in Sonora.

Mexico City, Aug. 28.—Americans and British subjects who were captured by Pedro Zamora, the Jalisco bandit, at Cuale on August 26 are believed to have escaped from the outlaws during a battle near the town of Autlan, State of Jalisco, this morning. Reports to this effect were received by Gen. Rafael Esquina, who is making an investigation. Zamora's force, numbering about 400, were routed in the fight, which lasted four hours. They lost forty-three killed and fled in three groups, which are being closely pursued by Government troops. A rebel band, said to have come from the United States and believed to have been commanded by Jose Maria Maytorena, former Governor of Sonora, clashed with Government forces at Altar, Sonora, and were driven back toward the United States, it was stated in a report received here today from Gen. Carlos Blank, chief of operations at Cananea, of the same State. The Democrats say that the rebels lost two dead and six wounded, and declares they were North American filibusters.

**VILLA'S FOLLOWERS  
GO BACK TO FARMS**

Former Rebels Surrender Their Arms and Disperse.

Mexico City, Aug. 27.—Work of mustering out the followers of Francisco Villa, the former rebel chieftain, was completed this afternoon at Tlahualilo, state of Durango, according to a report received from General Eugenio Martin, who superintended the operation. All of Villa's men surrendered their arms and ammunition and received pay for three months. The balance of their year's pay, which was promised, will be given them later. Officers were allowed to retain their pistols for self-defense, and all the men were given safe conducts and transportation to their farms in the states of Chihuahua, Durango and Coahuila.

All took an affectionate farewell of Villa, who advised them to avoid politics and devote themselves to rustic pursuits. Villa and General Martin will go to-morrow to Canutillo, state of Durango, where the former will be established on a farm.

**First Woman Jury Acts Past.**

INDIANAPOLIS, Aug. 28.—It took a jury of twelve women in the court of Justice of the Peace T. Ernest Mahon here today just five minutes to reach a verdict in a suit growing out of a dispute over a talking machine. They decided in favor of the plaintiff. It was the first jury of women ever summoned in Indiana, and was composed of leading women in all walks of life in the city.

**Pennay Pays \$23,000,000.**

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 28.—The Pennsylvania Railroad today distributed to employees the bulk of the back pay ordered in the decision of the United States Railway Labor Board of July 26. Approximately \$23,000,000 was distributed to the 277,000 to 289,000 workers.

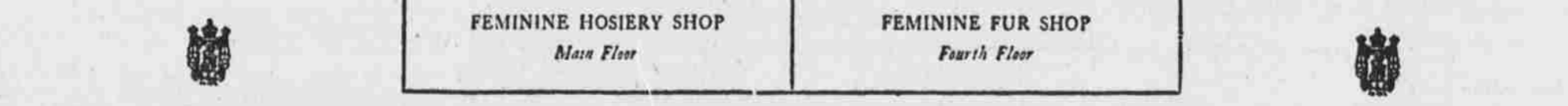
