STATE NEWS.

The old camp of Berlin, in Nye county, promises to be a hummer next Summer.

The delinquent tax list of Nye county fills five columns of the Tonopah Bonanza.

The Record, of Gardnerville, has installed a Simplex typesetting machine.

A company has been organized in Reno to complete and remodel the Riverside Hotel, in that town.

A man named Frank Bachus, of Reno says he was born in 1790. This would make him who is hale and hearty, 115 years old.

Jim Butler, of Tonopah, is figuring on buying the Overland hotel in Reno. The price asked is \$75,000.

A chance is reported in the near future of the Tonopah postmaster.

The heirs of the estate of Mayor O'Connor, of Reno, are now fighting who shall administer the property.

Thirty thousand head of sheep are snowbound in the Panhandle range of mountains in White Pine county. The sheep were being taken to winter range in Nye county when the storm came on. There is no immediate danger of loss of animals unless another severe storm occurs.

T. G. Lockhart, one of the owners of the owners of the celebrated Florence mine, at Goldfield, has been held to appear before a grand jury on a charge of bribery. It is alleged that he offered the engineer at the mine \$500 to blow up the works so that the rich ore being taken out by leasers would be left in the mine.

A fellow by the name of E. G. Dorman, of Tonopah, after sending his wife to Salt Lake to spend the holidays with her relatives, and promising to join her later, has sold all his property in Tonopah and left for parts unknown, after writing his wife that she would never see him again. Mrs. Dorman is coming back to Tonopah and will make things interesting for Dorman if he can be found.

Of Interest to Miners.

A case was recently decided by a jury trial in a Butte, Montana court, where a locator of a quartz vein within a patented placer was declared to be within his rights, says the Mining and Scientific Press. The ground was located in 1880 as placer. The placer was patented later, but in 1890 other parties entered the placer and located a lode claim on it. Defendant claims that the patent gave him exclusive right to the ground and that he had held undisputed and undisturbed possession of the claims for six years, and that the claim was good against all comers, and moved a non-suit. The court decided that such claim could only be allowed when the government contested the title. The defendant further claimed that there was not a sufficient showing of quartz on the claim in 1880 to justify working the property as a lode claim. This contention was overruled by the court. A patent to a placer claim is not prima facie evidence of the fact that the knowledge exists within the limits of the placer claim at date of application. The disposition of the Department is to consider that if the lode actually exists at the time of filing application for placer patent, such lode is reserved by operation of law, whether located or not. The law relative to lodes within placer is another phase of existing mining legislation that needs a change to remove from it that element of ambiguity and uncertainty.
