DECISION IN PUBLIC RECORDS CASE.

The supreme court of Nevada handed down a decision in the public records case that was taken up from Tonopah.

The court held that the plaintiff a searcher of records, had no right in the records of the county unless he could show beneficial interest, which will, in effect, bar him from access except upon the sufferance of the public officials.

The case attracted much attention as it involves the right of the public to have access to the public records except when they are in use by the officials in whose care they are placed.—Gazette.

Goldbutte Mining Camp.

The new mining camp of Goldbutte in the St. Thomas Mining district, Lincoln county, Nevada, is beginning to attract some attention. The Nevada Gold Butte Mines Co., Ltd., of Salt Lake, was the first to occupy this new field, and now has a force of men at work getting out a trial shipment of ore. W. E. Sharpe is doing development work on his ground adjoining the Gold Butte holdings on the west. Harry Gentry is also rounding out some work on property he owns in that locality, while Dana Gibbs has succeeded in locating some most promising ground north of the Gold Butte. Mr. Gibbs is backed by some of the Ansonia Lumber crowd at Kimberly, Utah, and a short time ago O. Wiser, representing the Kimberly Nevada Gold Mines association, left for this inviting section, his intention being to remain there a few weeks. The formation at Goldbutte is a porphyritic granite and the ledges are fissures. A surprising amount of free gold, in quartz, is found at the surface, and it has been stated that when it becomes known in mining circles what this locality offers, there will be a rush there equal to that which has since made Goldfield so justly famous.
