Commissioner's Meeting.

The Board met Monday February 6th, 1906, at 10 o'clock, and the following bills were presented and read, approved and signed by the Chairman of the Board. Reports of all County Officers for the month of December 1905 were read and approved.

Bills for December 1905 allowed as per Clerk's Register claim book. Three bills for Wm. E. Abbott for road work for the sum of \$200 were ordered returned to have Road Inspectors sign the bills.

There being but one bid in for the construction of County Bridge near Caliente, the contract was awarded to James Lamoine for the sum of \$275.00.

Ordered that lots 20 to 63 inclusive in Block 33, town of Pioche now owned by the County be sold to A. W. Scott for the sum of \$75.00 also lot 58 Block 25 town of Pioche owned by the County be sold to A. W. Scott for the sum of \$30.00.

Ordered that lots 18 and 19 in Block 1 of the town of Pioche owned by the County be sold to Wm. E. Orr for the sum of \$50.00, and lots 16 and 20 in Block 31 owned by the County be sold to Wm. E. Orr for the consideration of \$10.00. Reports of County Officers approved.

Bills for the month of January as per Register claim Book were allowed.

Townsite Plat of east end Addition of the Town of Southlight was presented for approval and the Plat complying with all the requirements of the law was approved and signed by the Chairman of the Board.

The Bill of A. S. Thompson Co., for stage fare of R. M. Lee's Call to Pioche was rejected for the reason that the same had not been authorized by any member of the Board.

An execution was presented and signed by Wm. D. Myer and J. P. Lee vs Lincoln County, judgment of the court being in favor of the Plaintiff for the sum of \$68.00 and costs of suit amounting to the sum of \$16.00, this matter was laid over until March meeting for further investigation.

Order of a new resident from Creighton School District No. 30 was formed.

An order was made that a special meeting of the Board of County Commissioners be held Monday March 5th, 1906, for the purpose of drawing a jury list sufficient for the March term of court, and for the transaction of all regular monthly business.

The following transfers were made, from the General County Fund to the Salary Fund the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars, and from the General County Fund to the State Fund the sum of \$100.00.

No special rate was levied for either Bankerville or Caliente, for interest on School Bonds.

Meeting adjourned until Monday March 5th, 1906.

Mr. Ernest Godbe and Mr. F. Wilson, the latter representing the American Smelting & Refining Company, have been with us the past week. This is Mr. Wilson's first trip to this section and he is most favorably impressed with the general mining outlook. The amount of low-grade fluxing ores that abound here are somewhat astonishing, and the nearby large smelters will surely draw from this section a vast and large tonnage. With the advent of the railroad here, Mr. Wilson says that we will be one of the largest shipping camps of fluxing and other ores to the smelters. This is most gratifying news coming as it does from such a representative.

Nine Miles of Table

There seems to be no doubt that the banquet dinner given in honor of President Loubet by the National Federation of Mutual Aid Societies of France was the greatest feast that has been held in modern times. At this banquet, which was spread in the Galerie des Machines in the Champs de Mars, no less than 50,000 people sat down simultaneously at over nine miles of tables. The dinner was served by 3,500 waiters, and in the course of the feast 165,000 plates were used, not to mention 70,000 forks and 50,000 knives. Food and drink to the extent of 1,300 tons were thus consumed, which had arrived at the banquet hall in 3,500 vans. The beverages consisted of wine, milk, water and black coffee, which were drunk out of 125,000 tin-ables.

This banquet at which there assembled delegates from all over France, was given to mark the close of President Loubet's term of office. The Galerie des Machines, in which it was given, is the largest covered hall in the world. Previous to the banquet a monster procession took place, the 50,000 "mutualists" assembling in the Tuileries gardens and marching thence with bands playing and flags flying to the Trocadero. There President Loubet made them a short speech, enthusiastically applauded, on the usefulness of provident societies, after which he was presented with a statuette symbolizing mutual aid. Then the crowd marched on to its record-breaking banquet. The arrangements for the banquet were remarkable. There were half a dozen courses, and at some tables twice as much as the people could eat—Exchange.
