

PRICE PUT ON JEWS

BERLIN, June 27.—Prominent Jews here are now receiving details of the massacres and plundering of Jews in various parts of Russia.

At Saroki the authorities posted a telegram, alleged to have been received from the czar, ordering all Jews killed, and the peasants attacked and stayed many.

Wealthy Gentiles at Mieshin offered \$5 for each Jew killed, \$2 for every one wounded and \$1 for each male infant killed. Peasants are arming to enrich themselves.

The bodies of the victims were horribly mutilated. Limbs were hacked off, eyes gouged out, nails driven in the heads, faces battered to jelly and all sorts of barbarous brutalities practiced. Women and children received the same treatment as men and the conditions prevailing are indescribable.
