 At a meeting of the State Central Committee of the Democratic and Silver Party of Nevada, held at Reno, Nevada, on August 29, 1906, at 12 noon, for the purpose of nominating a ticket to be voted for at the next general election, to be held Tuesday, November 6, 1906, consisting of:  
 One Representative to Congress  
 One Governor  
 One Lieutenant Governor  
 One Justice of the Supreme Court  
 One Secretary of State  
 One Attorney General  
 One State Treasurer  
 One State Controller  
 One Surveyor General  
 One Superintendent of Public Instruction

 Members of the State Board of University Regents  
 District Judges of the various Judicial Districts of Nevada  
 Also for the selection of a State Central Committee and the transaction of all other business as may properly come before it. The basis of organization of the respective parties in said conventions for each party shall be the delegate for each fifty votes or any fraction thereof not less than twenty-five cast for Hon. H. E. Searles Democratic and Silver Party candidate for Justice of the Supreme Court in 1904, aggregating 112 delegates for each convention apportioned as follows:

**Primary Election**  
 of the people in accordance with the statutes in such cases made and provided for Saturday, August 11, 1906, for the purpose of electing delegates to said conventions, in accordance with the above basis of representation.  
**The Test**  
 At said primary elections the test to be exacted by those voting at the Democratic primaries shall be as follows: "I am a Democrat," and at the Silver Party primaries, "I am a Silver Party."  
**The Primaries**  
 Resolved, That the delegates to the conventions be selected at primaries wherever practicable, and where no primaries can be held the County Central Committees shall appoint delegates and where there is no county committee the local members of the State Central Committee shall be authorized and directed to appoint, and where there is no County Central Committee, or members of the State Central Committee, the State Executive Committee of the State Central Committee of each party shall make the appointments.  
 Secretaries of the various County Central Committees are requested to forward a certified list of the delegates so elected or appointed to the chairmen of the State Central Committees of both parties.

**MINING NOTES**  
 From all Parts

**SOMETHING ABOUT WONDER**  
 Wonder is situated between the Chalk Mountain and Horse Creek, twenty-two miles northeast of Fairview and about eighty miles to the nearest railroad point. This district was discovered in the early part of June, and sensational values were found on the surface. The ore is extremely rich in chloride of silver with accompanying sulphides and bromides. Float rock was picked up on the ground carrying values of from \$247 to \$900.  
 There are from 75 to 100 tents in the town, but no buildings erected as yet. A severe handicap is lack of water, all of which must be hauled from West Gate at a cost of \$6 per barrel. It is reported that water has been found within three miles, and if so it will be of material advantage to the early development of the district.  
 The shaft on the Fairview Consolidated has attained a depth of twenty feet, and the bottom is now in vein matter.  
 The new district of Chlorine seems to be attracting some attention. Salt Lake people appear to have been the first in the field and have secured some good property.  
 It is reported that a very rich strike has been made on the Jumper mine near Jamestown, Cal., and a strong vein of very rich ore has been uncovered.  
 Carload shipments of ore have been recently made from mines in the Charleston range, not far from Las Vegas. This property was opened up by Las Vegas people.  
 According to the Salt Lake Herald Grig H. Young has returned from a trip into Nevada on the line of the Western Pacific with samples of fine looking copper ore.  
 Active work is being advanced on the Silver King property at Fairview and the main tunnel is now in thirty-five feet, and when the vein is crossed drifts will be run. In prospecting this claim a good showing was made.
