THE CROSS FOR SARAH

PARIS, July 19.—Sarah Bernhardt has been decorated with the cross of the Legion of Honor, after years of agitation on the question whether that distinction could be conferred on her.

The globe indicates that France has finally officially recognized the claims of the "Devine Sarah" to the highest civic recognition that republic can bestow. It comes rather late, like the recognition of the innocence of Capt. Dreyfus, but Madam Bernhardt's admirers throughout the world will applaud this tribute to her genius.

The honor has been withheld from her all these years because of some row she had with the Comedie Francaise, a national theatre run under the auspices of the government. She was the leading lady. The manager attempted to dictate to Sarah one day, but flinging her resignation in his face, she gathered her gowns about her and went on a strike. Paris was agitated at her nerve, and predicted that she would fall, but she went on on her own hook and conquered the dramatic world.

She spread the French tragedy and the beauties of the French tongue all over Europe and America. She was the only foreigner that could act so well that her liquid language was not necessary to make one enjoy the play, and her entrancing French had such a subtle charm that it delighted people who could not understand a word of it. Every where she went she advertised France, and now in her old age France has laid the cross of honor at her feet.

She has reached the pinnacle of success where this cross can only be regarded as a bauble. Its bestowed adds nothing to her fame and it cannot supersede the immortal crown of dramatic glory the world placed upon her brow years ago.

Twelve years behind time in justice to Dreyfus and a quarter of a century late in decorating the breast of Bernhardt with the Cross of the Legion, France is indeed a great nation, but a trifle slow in reaching conclusions.
